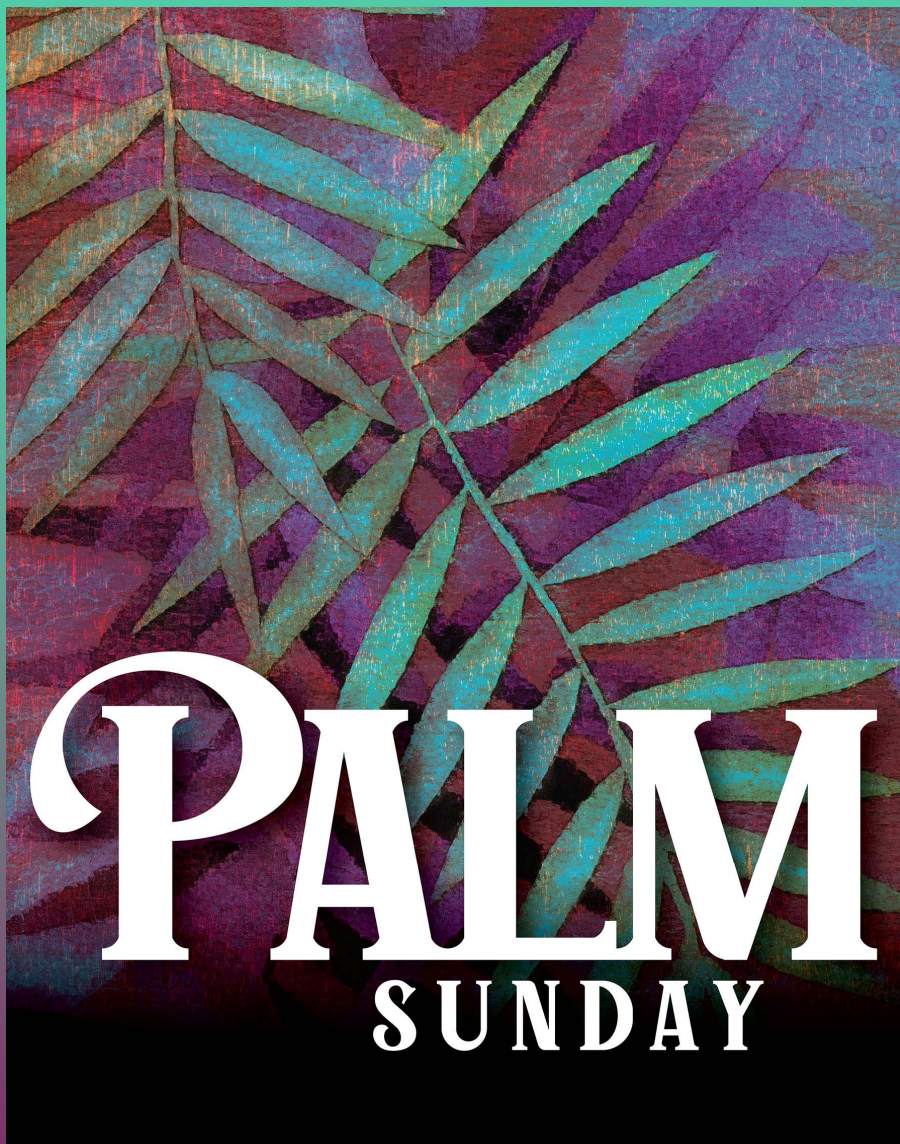

- Fast from self-centeredness; feast on compassion.
- Fast from complaining; feast on appreciation.
- Fast from giving up; feast on enthusiasm.
- Fast from the shadows of sorrow; feast on trust in God.
- Fast from focusing on problems; feast on unceasing prayer.
- Fast from anxiety; feast on faith.

**March 29 ~ Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion**

The challenge before us this weekend is to listen attentively to the message in our readings because we know well the end of the story. Believing, as we do that the word of God is ever new, try to listen as if hearing of these events for the first time. Notice how quickly the mood of the crowd changes from “Hosanna” to “Crucify him! Crucify him!” What words or actions linger in your heart as you walk with Jesus in his passion? As one of his disciples, with whom are you standing, with the frightened disciples or with Mary, Jesus’ mother? This week we come face to face with Jesus’ choice to endure death for our sake and to save us from our selfishness and sin. What will you say to Jesus in response to his extraordinary act of love for you?

**Youth Choir at the Cathedral**

The St. Agatha Parish Youth Choir took part in the Pueri Cantores Youth Choir Festival and Mass on Saturday, March 14 at the Cathedral of the Holy

Cross. The Youth Choir, made up this year of eight Saint Agatha School students, had been preparing the festival repertoire for months during their regular weekly rehearsals. The Festival was a day-long event including several rehearsals with the combined choir of 175 voices from around New England. Mr. Paul French, the president of the board of directors of American Federation Pueri Cantores and a celebrated church musician with a thriving choral program at Our Lady of Mount Carmel parish in Chicago, was the festival conductor. Mr. Richard Clark, Cathedral organist, Archdiocesan music director, and parent of 4<sup>th</sup> grade SAS student Addie, served as organist for the Festival. The festival culminated in the afternoon Mass for the Fourth Sunday of Lent with Archbishop Richard Henning.

With 32 federations comprising 70,000 young singers worldwide, Pueri Cantores is the international student choral organization of the Roman Catholic Church, whose mission is to evangelize and catechize choristers through the medium of sacred music, aiding them in growing in their faith and rooting them ever deeper to the Church. This year was the third annual festival in which our parish Youth Choir took part.

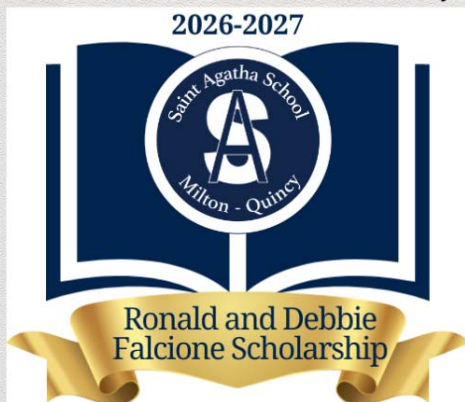
## Two Students Earn the 2026–2027 Falcione Scholarship at Saint Agatha School

Saint Agatha School is proud to announce two winners of the 2026–2027 Ronald '63 and Debbie Falcione Scholarship: Jack J. and Dalena N. The financial scholarship covers a full year of tuition, valued at \$8,350, for the upcoming school year. Each year, the award honors one boy and one girl from the current Grade 6 class who will be entering Grade 7, recognizing students who exemplify gratitude and reflect the core values of Saint Agatha School.

The selection process began in December 2025 when Grade 6 students were invited to write a short essay in response to a prompt created by Mr. and Mrs. Falcione. Students were asked to imagine speaking directly to Saint Agatha and describe what they like most about their school, as well as areas for improvement. Essays could reflect on class subjects, athletics, special events, religious life, or other experiences at Saint Agatha School.

After careful consideration of many thoughtful submissions, the Scholarship Committee selected Jack J and Dalena N as the two recipients. Their essays stood out for being well-written and genuine. They highlighted the value of attending Saint Agatha School and portrayed a love of learning that will carry with them throughout their lives.

The committee felt that both students' responses closely reflected our mission at Saint Agatha School and the spirit in which the Falcione Scholarship was created, making them excellent choices for this honor. Ronald and Debbie Falcione will visit Saint Agatha School on Thursday, April 9, 2026, to personally present the scholarship awards to Jack and Dalena and celebrate their achievements with the school community.



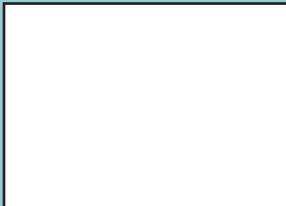
