

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, our readings offer a sober reminder that this life is not our aim and that God's justice will triumph in the end. Now is the time to get our priorities in order, putting God above all else as his faithful stewards.

Our Lord brings home the urgency of right priorities in our Gospel passage from Luke, reminding the people around him who were looking at the temple nearby, "All that you see here—the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." Our Lord reminds us that all in this world is passing. We must keep our focus on eternity.

Yet before the eternal bliss of heaven, we should expect to be tried and tested. "Before all this happens, however, they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name."

Sounds scary. But if you are living a stewardship way of life, there is nothing to fear. You have a plan in place. All you need to do is stick with it. Put our Lord first in your time, with your talents, and through your use of treasure. This way of life is not easy. But Jesus promises it will lead to eternal salvation and the joy of union with Him. "You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance, you will secure your lives."

Onward, Christian stewards, the struggle is worth the joy that awaits!

St. Vincent de Paul Annual Financial Report

July 1, 2024-June 30, 2025

To our Dear St. Vincent de Paul Parishioners,

We meet monthly with Fr. Philip and Wendy Perez, who is the Business Manager. The Finance Council's job is to review the financials, have input on the budget, and ensure fiscal transparency with the congregation. We advise and support Fr. Philip's goals by ensuring that your funds are used responsibly and are meeting the This Report is for last fiscal year, July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025.

Total Income was \$3.4 M.

Total Expense was \$4.2 M. Final expenses for the Capital Campaign project are included.

In addition to the Church renovation, facility highlights include

- 1. Physical improvement of new floors, ceiling, a bottle-filler, and improved security to the preschool wing off the church.
- 2. Handicapped accessibility entrance to the Johnson Activity Center.
- 3. HVAC, Irrigation, Rectory Chimney, and roof are ongoing maintenance updates.

Now to update the status of the Capital Campaign, Revive Revere, Reach. Final construction and expenses were completed in January of 2025. Our Loan of \$945K was established in February, and monthly payments were set. As of September 30, our loan balance is \$640K. We are working to pay this balance off as soon as possible to both reduce the interest paid and focus on future monetary needs of the parish. All payments made to the Capital Campaign will continue to be free of Diocesan tax, throughout the life of the loan. The Finance Council is anticipating a current and pressing need of the Parish – new chairs for the Johnson Activity Center. While that may seem an odd concern, our chairs are all 30 or more years old. Do you feel comfortable or safe sitting in them? Have you looked closely at the youth couches in the basement? Or the padded chairs? Some have witnessed chairs break under long time use and pressure. Couches and padded chairs will no longer come clean or provide comfort. Parishioners and Hall Renter's alike have voiced their concern. It is not a welcoming experience for the many activities, events and rental opportunities we offer. It is becoming disruptive to our Rental revenue stream. We have a Chair Team in place and plan on using #iGiveCatholic funds to replace the folding chairs, the youth seating in the basement, and the padded chairs, in that order. Coming soon is a video release starring our clergy, seminarian, police officer...and the chairs. More than just financial statistics and numbers, Parish ministry statistics and numbers complete the full view of Parish life:

126 New Families have joined the Parish!

We had 41 Baptisms, 45 Youth Confirmations, 43 1st Holy Communions, 12 marriages, and 45 came into the Church at Easter

Formation Registrations include 271 Children & Youth, 280 adults, 322 VBS participants.

We continue to have a dynamic outreach into both the parish and community serving 1348 individuals with necessities such as rent, mortgage, utilities and more. Outreach expenses were \$160K, 8% of Offertory. In this challenging financial time, the Finance Council thanks you for the faithful and intentional stewardship of your treasure; and your patience with continued Capital Campaign efforts.

It is you, our parishioners, that make St. Vincent de Paul the warm, generous and caring church that it is.

We are excited for the future. Humbled by past accomplishments and look forward to our stewardship in action in the years ahead.

Social Outreach

With Stewardship as our way of life, Outreach expense was \$159,336 this year, 7.7% of total Offertory.

Individual Outreach department is humble to report our parish positively impacted the lives of over 1,348 individuals with necessities such as rent, mortgage, utilities, auto repair/insurance/loans, storage unit rent (to store possessions of displaced families), back-to-school supplies, tech. educational tools, tuition scholarships, gift cards for hygiene/household/baby items essentials, non-perishable food, holiday meals and Christmas gifts. We value your sacrifices and strive to stretch every dollar to support our community partners, fellow parishioners, and our community neighbors facing uncertainty and life-altering hardships. SVdP Outreach is proud to have the unwavering and generous support of our parishioners, because of you, relief to the vulnerable and those facing hardships in our community remain strong!

<u>Harvest for Hope</u>: Our 2025 parish-wide community service project — Care Kits for Homeless (on 11/7 and 11/9, co-hosted with our Faith Formation team) is in full-swing! An abundance of donations continues to arrive daily. The care kits will offer relief, encouragement, hope and love to our homeless neighbors. Our goal is to host parishioners to assemble over 500 plus care kits. The bright-colored care kits and patriotic bags (for Veterans) will be filled with an assortment of winter essentials, toiletries, hygiene items, journals, playing cards, activity books/games, and non-perishable snacks. In advance, thank you for your time spent in shopping, presorting, and assembling the care kits in fellowship in His name.






