

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ—June 18

Remember the joke when we were kids... how did Helen Keller's parents punish her? By re-arranging the furniture. - ba-da-bum.

Ok, I'll admit, it's probably not politically correct to use that anymore, but I hope it will illustrate a thought I've been having a lot lately. There are some things we can do with our eyes closed, in the dark, without thinking. We can walk around a room in the dark at night - for example - if we are familiar with the lay of the space. This is a great thing. If things are moved around, then we can't maneuver as well.

We can sing along with the songs on the radio without thinking about the words. And the more the song is committed to memory, the more you can belt it out and sing it with feeling!

The prayers at Mass are like that too. Many prayers of the Mass are the same each week. It's very beautiful because we can enter into the prayers when they are committed to memory, and really belt them out with feeling!

But...

Most of the time it isn't the case. We say the words in a rote manner, from our memory only. I have actually found myself able to drift off and think about other things while I'm reciting a prayer I know so well. Our Father who art...did I add bread to my shopping list? Holy Holy, Lord...what time is my dentist appointment tomorrow?

Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof...that baby two rows up is SO cute!

Do you ever do that? Get distracted when you're reciting words committed to your memory?

We can turn it around! We can make the prayers as meaningful as the songs we sing with passion. We can proclaim the Mass rather than just recite it! For it is FULL of wonderful promises and declarations about who God is. The Church has these prayers in place for the very reason that we can enter in together, as a church family and pray the prayers with one voice. There is no thought as to "what is next? What should I do now? What is this new prayer?" No, we enter into a beautiful chorus together. And not just at Sts. Mary and Joseph, but in any Catholic Church in any part of the world. We can be part of the prayer in any language, because we know what the next verse is!

When we sing a song we know by heart, our head allows us to sing it. But when our head and heart are in it together, <u>that's</u> when the passion flows from our mouths.

Picture a 15 passenger van filled with teens going on vacation. A popular song comes on the radio and they begin to sing, one by one, until the whole van is erupting with song, passion, arm movements!

Now imagine our church, filled with US; you and Me — one-by-one as we begin to recite a prayer we know in our head. Then we put our heart into it! The passion for the words grow, we lift up our arms in praise! The church is on FIRE because the words matter!

I encourage us all to pray on the words of the Mass. They are beautiful! Let them speak to your heart, so at church YOU can proclaim them with feeling!


