

Sixth Sunday of Easter, May 6

On Easter Sunday my family got to talking about leaving Mass after Communion. So I thought I'd take a stab at the topic – here goes.

First off, I don't know the many situations that would create a need to leave Mass early. Perhaps job obligations or a sick loved one left at home. I also imagine that some people feel Mass is over and the rest of Mass is just details they don't need to stay for. I am so glad that everyone is gathered together in the first place! And it's not my place to judge or point a finger. We are a parish family. Each person in the pew is an important part of the family. I am so glad you are here!

I think when we know there is VALUE in something, it makes it worth our time. Although there are several reasons worth staying after Communion, I will just touch on one: *Gratitude*. God humbled Himself to leave His throne in heaven, live on earth and die for us. God gives us the gift of His body & blood. After we receive the Eucharist it's the time to contemplate the living Christ within us. To sit for a quiet moment and thank God for all His blessings, telling Him the desires of our heart and asking how He needs me to spread His love this coming week.

The Eucharistic meal is much like a holiday meal with family. We wouldn't just eat and get up from the table and leave without a word of thanks to our hosts. We would thank them and receive a word from them, as we do from the priest at the conclusion of Mass.

I pray for each of us that our Eucharistic prayer would draw us close to Christ. That it would enrich our relationship with Him and draw us closer to the others in the pews as we pray to become more fully the Body of Christ.
