

The world/humanity is badly flawed; we know that because we suffer from it daily. But, if we seek the Lord daily in our prayer, our work, our relationships, then our "groaning" will be for that final union with Jesus, for that long-awaited perfection that we call heaven. The Celebration of Mass has resumed at Saints Mary & Joseph Parish on a FIRST COME, FIRST SEATED basis (you DO NOT NEED TO CALL in to reserve a space for Mass. Also, confessions will be at the normal time and by appointment. We are gradually returning to our regular schedules.)

To provide as safe and clean an environment as possible, we ask those coming to Mass to observe the following:

<u>Parishioners must wear masks</u> from the moment they leave their car until they return. Masks will be provided for those without. **Father will wear his mask for distribution of Communion.**

Ushers will accompany worshipers to one of <u>the places marked in the church</u>. To avoid contact with others, <u>seating will begin at the front of the church and continue to the back</u>. Once all the marked places have been taken, no one else will be admitted to the church.

Hymnals have been removed from the churches .

Communion will be distributed <u>during the Mass at the normal time</u>. Please wait for an usher to direct you to leave your bench, then practice the six-foot distancing, as marked on the floor.

The church will be sanitized immediately after Mass.

We are committed to following these protocols for the safety of our parish community, our liturgical ministers and our clergy. *To this end, parishioners who are not able or unwilling to follow these guidelines will be asked by ushers to leave.*

For those who are unable to return to Mass, we will continue to "live stream" ALL of the Sunday Masses from Mary Queen of Peace. Communion will be offered in the church, in front of the Tabernacle, after the 9:30am mass attendees have exited, from 10:20-10:50 am. While this is far from the ideal celebration of the Eucharist, it is a positive step forward as we resume our life as a parish community and celebrate our identity as the people of God.

Early Fall Cleaning......Fr. Marc has a little extra time on his hands (because of COVID) and a fresh set of eyes (a new perspective) so he is refreshing the buildings at the St. Joseph Campus—to start. He will be doing the same at Mary Queen of Peace at a later time. There is no need to worry because he is dealing with things that should have been dealt with long ago! Hello Saints Mary and Joseph Parish,

My name is Deacon Joseph Moynahan. I am a transitional Deacon preparing to enter my last year of seminary formation (year six of six) at St. John Seminary in Brighton, before, God willing, being ordained a Priest next June. Usually, during the

Summer months Bishop Libasci assigns his seminarians to a Pastor in order to be at a parish to get a lived-experience of parish priest ministry and the life of a parish priest. For those of us who live close enough to the Diocese, during our last year in Seminary, typically, we keep our Summer assignment throughout the academic year. That means basically that on the weekends, for the most part, I will be in the parish serving as Deacon for Fr. Marc. Prior to coming to Salem, I was with Fr. Marc at St. Michael (Exeter) and St. Mary (Newmarket) Parishes, an assignment that had begun on June 3rd.

I am originally from Eliot, Maine. In 2005 my family and I moved out to Southern Indiana. I returned to the Seacoast in 2011. However, the parish in which I was raised was Immaculate Conception Parish, in Portsmouth. Since 2006, Immaculate Conception had been consolidated with two other parishes in Portsmouth and thus the new Parish, Corpus Christi was generated. Though it had changed a bit from when I was young, I am so happy to call Corpus Christi my home parish. And thanks to the hospitality and generosity of the Pastor, Fr. Gary Belliveau, I reside at the rectory- named Vianney House- when I am not at seminary or assignment.



Before entering seminary I was an R.N. for about six years. In 2009 I had received my bachelor's degree in nursing and worked in Indiana, Chicago, and Portsmouth. For the most part I worked in critical care and then transitioned into a cardiac catheterization lab. It was a career which I loved, but the Lord had (and has) a different gift to give me, the Sacrament of Holy Orders, for which I am forever grateful.

I look forward to ministering to you as Deacon as I prepare for the Priesthood next year, and I look forward to getting to know you.

Did you know? If you are 72 or older and need to take a "required minimum distribution (RMD)" from an IRA retirement account, a direct distribution to a qualified charitable organization, such as our parish, can save you money on your taxes. Such a donation will count toward your required minimum distribution but will be excluded from taxable income. Ask your tax preparer or IRA trustee for the details.
