



October 11, 2020—Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

During these months we hear a lot about forming our consciences in the Truth: truth about God, about mankind, about creation in making serious decisions. There are two great mistakes made about conscience in today's world. Many make the mistake that conscience is the ultimate judge of the 'good for me'. Basically, meaning if my conscience judges a certain action to be good and able to perfect me (lead me to God) then that makes said action good. Others mistake the conscience to be a factor removing responsibility, so that even if they choose to do a bad act they can't be held responsible because their conscience judged it to be ok. The first error is much like the sin of Eden, they wanted to determine for himself what is good and evil. It forgets that conscience and Truth necessarily go together. Being creatures, we cannot create nor determine what is good for us or what is harmful for us. What is good or bad for us is determined by our human nature. From which there is no stepping outside of nor escaping. The second error has a couple of issues. First, it makes the mistake that one is not responsible for forming his or her conscience in the Truth. Second, it undermines the fact that all of our freely chosen actions either lead us to God or away from God. Conscience is a judgement about the good to be done. But it's the good that perfects human nature.
