

TAKE A STEP IN FAITH! God will never be outdone in His generosity! The proportion of our gift becomes sacrificial when it comes from our substance rather than our abundance. When we give out of substance, we are changed in the process: we have given away something we thought we needed for ourselves, thus changing our lifestyle, and we have acted on our belief that our security lies not in our material resources but in God. Our intentional response to God’s generosity should ensure that we give the “first fruits” - those gifts given first and not only after other obligations have been satisfied . And they are proportionate to what God has given us. As such, our gift of money is appropriately presented at the Offertory at Mass. The celebration of Christ’s sacrifice is a fitting context for our own sacrificial offering which is a grateful response to the unfathomable love God has shown for us!

- Know that wire transfers, prepaid debit cards and other immediate forms of payments are often used in fear-based scams.
- Do not click on links in texts or emails related to COVID, and do not give out personal information through text or phone.

**“I am the bread of life; Whoever comes to me will never hunger,
and whoever believes in me will never thirst.”**

Often we limit the reference here to the Eucharist, but I believe Jesus is also referring to his Word... with the teachings that I used for our Children’s Ministry event a couple weeks ago (*take the lower seat, the first shall be last and the last shall be first, give instead of receiving, seek first the kingdom*) God continues to challenge me: “Okay, Sue... you really want those kids to believe these words are the way to real satisfaction? Then you need to live them and be a witness to how they are fulfillment and life!” My siblings and I are in the process of going through our dad’s home. There are two things I REALLY wanted: a dresser I used most of my childhood and our mom’s special dinnerware. I let it be known if someone wanted something I did, then he/she could have it. Ugh! My oldest brother wanted that dresser! “Ok, Sue, let it go.... The last 2 years he left behind his art, music and single free life to move in and care for Dad. At least you were promised you could have the dinnerware.” This past weekend in clearing out the house the dinnerware is nowhere! It was misunderstood which dishes I wanted and someone else took the ones I wanted. What?!!!! “Okay, Sue, let it go... someone else needs them more than you. I can fulfill you more than that dinnerware. Have I not shown you that time and time again? Follow Jesus’ example: others first, seek FIRST my kingdom, give cheerfully...” “Ok, God, keep bringing on these opportunities so others will know I truly believe in You!”

Things to Do During Eucharistic Adoration—Part 2

Here are more suggestions for what to do during private Eucharistic adoration.

Meditate using Scripture Choose a passage from the Bible. Read the words and ask God to let the passage speak to you. Pay special attention to anything that strikes you and ask God what He wishes for you to draw from that passage

Read the life of a saint and pray with him or her Most Holy men and women have had a great devotion to Our Lord in the Eucharist. Catherine of Sienna, Francis of Assisi, Thomas Aquinas, Dorothy Day, Mother Theresa of Calcutta are just a few. Read about them and pray their prayers before the Blessed Sacrament.

Ask for forgiveness and intercede for others: Think of those who have hurt you and request a special blessing for them. Ask God to forgive you for all the times you have neglected or hurt someone else. Bring before the Blessed Sacrament all those who have asked you to pray for them. Ask the Lord to address their concerns.

Sit Quietly and just “be” in the presence of God: Think of a visit to the Blessed Sacrament as coming to see your best friend. Sit quietly and enjoy being in each other’s company.
