

"...show no partiality as you adhere to the faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ. For if one in fine clothes comes... and a poor person in shabby clothes also comes in, and you pay attention to the one wearing the fine clothes... while you say to the poor one, "Stand there,"... have you not made distinctions among yourselves and become judges...?" (James 2:1-4)

Recently I found myself in a conversation where remarks were made by the way someone dressed. I struggled with the comments... then I realized I also make similar remarks within my family: one is always neatly dressed in well-coordinated clothes with hair neatly done, while another rarely matches, clothes are wrinkled and hair is unbrushed and disheveled. The message of this reading screams out at me and reminds me of:

But the Lord said... "Do not look on his appearance ... For the Lord sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart. 1 Samuel 16:7 They... said to him, "Teacher, we know you are true and do not care about anyone's opinion. For you are not swayed by appearances. Mark 12:14

Our challenge is to show no partiality... to not honor one over the other (in thought, word or deed) because of the way they look. Maybe God sees something we don't! Maybe this person is needed to serve a purpose God has chosen not to reveal to us!

When are we swayed because of appearance? Let us resist the temptation to be swayed!

Maybe we could even remind and encourage each other how to have the heart and mind of Christ...

<u>Eucharistic Miracles</u> At every Catholic Mass, following the command of Jesus himself, the celebrant raises the host and says, "Take this, all of you, and eat it: This is my body, which will be given up for you." Then he lifts the cup and says, "Take this, all of you, and drink from it: This is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me."

The doctrine of transubstantiation, the teaching that bread and wine are converted into the actual flesh and blood of Jesus Christ, is difficult. When Christ first told his followers of it, many rejected him. But Jesus did not clarify his statement or correct their misunderstanding. He simply repeated his command to the disciples at the Last Supper. Some Christians today still have trouble accepting this teaching.

Throughout history, though, many people have reported miracles that brought them back to the truth. The Church has recognized over one hundred eucharistic miracles, many of which occurred during times of weakened faith in transubstantiation.
