

When John, the Baptist, began his ministry of preaching the Gospel, the Good News, people from all walks of life came to him asking that question; "What should we do?" They had heard John's words calling for repentance and conversion, inspiring words that called for a change of heart that would result in a new creation. John first gave them practical ways to change but his ultimate goal was to help them become the presence of Jesus by being baptized with "The Holy Spirit and Fire." By coming to know Jesus and receiving His Spirit in Baptism, we would provide numerous opportunities for others to encounter Jesus. A deacon friend of mine, Dick Cloutier, in his homilies used to tell his parishioners where he saw Jesus during the prior week; one person he encountered who was acting toward others as Jesus had or would.

That's the challenge God and our Church gives us during this period of Advent and beyond; to be transformed such that you become mistaken for Jesus. This is impossible you might say but in a right relationship with God **nothing is impossible!**


