Pick of the Week:

- **A study on Lectio Peter (10 sessions):** The character of St. Peter is both inspiring and confounding to many of us. How could a stubborn and impulsive fisherman become the "rock" upon which Jesus would build his Church? Bringing together biblical accounts, historical evidence, Church teaching, classical art, and personal insights, Dr. Tim Gray gives a fresh perspective on Simon Peter that is immediately informative and relevant to our lives. After all, if Jesus could bring out the very best in someone like Peter, then there is hope for the rest of us.

FORMED Kids’ Korner:

- **The story of St. Augustine (36 min video):** Bright, young Augustine thinks his mother’s religion is foolishness. Convinced that his superior intellect will guide him, he sneaks away from home and ventures to a new life in the city of Rome. Soon Augustine finds himself in an important position as “The Voice of the Emperor,” with the life of luxury he’s always wanted.
- When the empire decides to take over the Christian basilica, Augustine prepares to give the speech of a lifetime, one that will slow the rising tide of Christianity’s influence. With his devout mother and the unwavering Bishop Ambrose on one side and the empire’s loyal soldiers on the other, Augustine must choose whom he will serve.

The Word Made Flesh: Have you ever heard something that sounded completely outlandish? The Jews in today’s Gospel are not just shocked by Jesus’ teaching, they are likely disgusted and offended. Father John was the **winner of the \$100 cash** for selling the most tickets **before** the fair.



- In the areas under "basic search" you will find complete listing of candidates for each federal, state and judicial office and their websites. Go to the websites and learn a little about the candidates.
- **Note:** You can only vote for one political party or the other. Unaffiliated candidates are lumped either into the DFL or GOP parties. 113 The Eyes of Faith So they said to Jesus, "What sign are you going to give us then, so that we may see it and believe you? What work are you performing?" (John 6:30)

Adults: When has your faith helped you believe without "seeing signs" from God?

Kids: Who helps you believe in things you cannot see?

"The first [commandment] is this: Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone!" (Mark 12:29) "Heart, O Israel!" *Shema Yisrael!* These words are the first in a section of the Torah that is the central prayer in the Jewish prayer book. So important is this prayer that Jewish people recite it as their last words, with their final breath. It's often the first section of Scripture that the Jewish child learns and is sometimes called "the bedtime Shema" because parents teach it to their children before they go to sleep at night. What a marvelous image: children being tucked into bed as darkness falls, wrapped in blankets and in their parents' loving reminder to listen, always listen, to what God may be saying. This central mantra of the Jewish people is a graced admonition for us as well: "Hear, O Israel!" Listen. Listen deeply and always. God's revelation is still happening, if only we open our ears and our hearts to listen. Sr. Chris Kollhoffer, IHM
