3. Bible Study Part II on Luke has 5 participants.
4. In Sept. we will have a demo at Mass on Formed & website.
5. Council members asked to gather any ideas for a parish mission speaker or topic for this coming year. Possibly something could be shared with the parishes at Greenbush and Warroad.
6. Missionary Disciples meeting this Thursday and doing a SWOT exercise on evangelization in our parishes. Will bring the results to our parish councils for their additions and input.
7. Looking at upcoming events -- Fr. John on vacation at end of August -- he will ask Food for the Poor and Cross Catholic Outreach to send less follow-up mailings after their priests visit us.
8. Religious freedom issue becoming more important to be aware of -- cf. MN Catholic Advocacy Network.
9. Reflected on parishioners that might need extra attention due to health issues or other difficulties at this time.
10. Amanda will share via meeting minutes a list for us to review of current and possible new committee to address different parish needs. This will be discussed and refined at our next meeting.
11. Fair booth sign-up is coming out. Some new signage and quotes for the booth and possibly new t-shirts being worked on.
12. Aug. 28 the summer youth group and North Country Pregnancy Center will sponsor the film, "Unplanned".
13. Fr. will send survey results out via email for our review.
14. Next meeting -- Monday, August 19 at 5:15 pm.

### Sacred Heart Financial Council Meeting— June 25th

1. Financial reports show that income and expenses are on budget.
2. Approved a budget for the coming fiscal year that is balanced and calls for only a slight increase in adult envelope income. Some increases for electrical utilities were budgeted but we will only know what they will more accurately be after the new building addition is in use. Our balance in checking and savings will be able to cover the uncertainties.
3. Fr. John and Marlene will work out the shared expenses for Badger and Falun so that they can finish their budgets.
4. Building project is going forward. Capital Campaign is working on mailing to encourage parishioners to return their pledges toward the payment of the building project loan that will need to take out likely in August. The building project raffles seems to be going well.
5. Fr. John has done performance reviews with Tracy and Sarah and some updates on their job descriptions.
6. The latest DAA report from the diocese shows us still \$750 short of our goal. Only 33% have made their contribution. Bishop has said that he really needs all parishes to make their goal and especially expects that of parishes like ours that have been given clearance for favorable loans from the diocesan community fund for building projects.
7. A slight increase in wages was given to employees.
8. At next meeting we will need to look at terms of office that are up.
9. Next meeting date will be Monday, Sept. 9 at 5:15 pm.

1. Cemetery committee has set date of Monday, July 15 at 4:00 pm to work on perpetual care fund decisions and some upkeep needs of the cemetery.
2. Shingling done on outhouse -- painting of trim to done by Dariel.
3. Were able to use cell phone as a hot spot for the television. So we will be doing a demo of the FORMED program and overview of our tri-parish website sometime and also some short clips on the Mass.
4. No adult formation programs going on during summer time.
5. Tri-parish Missionary Disciples team will be meeting this week to process where we are currently at in regards to evangelization and where we might make new efforts. We will bring results to the pastoral councils then for their input and additions.
6. There are increasing concerns about religious freedom issues in our state - see the MN Advocacy Network of the Minn. Bishops.
7. Latest financial report shows our finances are good. In the next year or so we will need to spend some larger funds to replace the shingles on the church roof.
8. The parish budget at Roseau is done. Fr. And Marlene are working on the shared expenses so that we will be able to get our own budget completed and sent in.
9. Hailey received good support from our parish for her Guatemala mission trip. The Ladies Guild will possibly also send some support to Rachel Hambrook from Roseau who will be spending next year on a NET team.
10. Still open to other options other than our usual summer picnic.
11. Bi-weekly sessions for youth Gr. 7-12 at Roseau going well.
12. Agreed on gift of \$250 to MSB celebrating 100th anniversary.
13. SHC fair food booth -- open to our help if able.
14. Next meeting -- Monday, Sept. 16 at 6:30 PM.



### **Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati** by Fr. Tim Deeter

Born in 1901 in Turin, Italy into a family of wealth and status, Pier Giorgio enjoyed close friends, hiking and skiing, museums and music, and was involved in political action. He found that deep prayer, service to the poor, and a passion for bringing others to Christ led to a life of purpose, peace, and happiness. Pier Giorgio died at the age of 24 on July 4, 1925. He was beatified on May 20, 1990 by Pope St. John Paul II who referred to him as a "man of the beatitudes". **Audio: 52mins**




