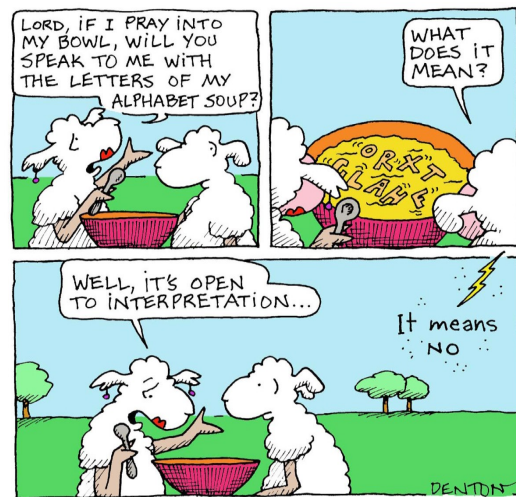

Capital Campaign / Building Project Update

- **Good news!** Currently we are still at **\$5,432.40 pledged or 102%** of the amount needed for our monthly payment of **\$5,335**. 77 households (43%) have responded with pledges .
- We ask **all who can** to share in helping to pay off our loan as quickly as possible.
- **Note: The \$10,000 Loan Pledge Challenge deadline has been extended to the fall supper.** Goals are: 108 households pledging and \$6,000 in pledges.
- Soffits on connector space and rectory done and insulation added to attic of rectory and connector space -- heat registers arrived and are being installed -- new cupola being installed this coming week.
- Continue to pray for the successful completion of the project and worker safety. -- Fr. John -
