

### Capital Campaign / Building Project Update

- We are still at **\$5,678 pledged or 106%** of the amount needed for our monthly payment of **\$5,335**. 77 households (43%) have made pledges.
- Have you made your pledge or contribution? (We are tight and a little short on funds for needed additions.) If unable to make a financial contribution then let us know if you are available to help with smaller work projects to finish our building project. The parking lot is unfinished due to lack of funds.
- **Let us all help to carry the load** of funds needed for the completion of this beautiful and needed renovation and addition. We are thankful for memorials to the building fund and to those making extra gifts when they can.
- **Note: The \$10,000 Loan Pledge Challenge deadline has been extended to the fall supper.** We need only \$320 more in monthly pledges and 31 additional households contributing to meet the challenge.
- Railing for south entrance has been installed. Help needed to finish landscaping.
- Continue to pray for the successful completion of the project and worker safety. -- Fr. John

### Sacred Heart FC Meeting Notes --June 23rd

1. We are thankful for those using on-line giving and auto bank withdrawal as well as their envelopes to sustain support for the parish finances. Our adult giving is down about \$1,000 per month from last year. We are helped by less expenses than budgeted but still concerned that all members support the parish and possibly increase giving a bit. We will say more when we finish the budget for the coming fiscal year (July 2020 - June 2021).
2. Building project is wrapping up. Help is needed for smaller projects such as landscaping and moving materials to new areas.
3. We are immensely grateful to Steve Pavek for leadership on the capital campaign without which we would not have been able to carry out our building project. He and Linda are moving to Lake Cormorant this summer but will keep in touch with us. Steve Dostal will be taking leadership of the remaining work of the Capital Campaign.
4. We recommend that we continue with the summer raffle and possibly a fair food sale to help recoup fund lost with the cancellation of the county fair and will talk to the KCs about the latter idea.
5. Fr. John will work on stewardship efforts when he returns from vacation on July 10.
6. Men decided not to strip and wax the church floor at this time -- possibly later before grand opening.
7. A memorial gift was received from the family of +Ida Novacek for a kiosk for the gathering space.
8. Next meeting is Tues. July 28 at 5:15 pm.



**Saint Peter** tells the epic story about the key event in European and world history: the spread of Christianity throughout the Roman Empire, focusing on the leader of that new religion. St. Peter is played by the renowned Egyptian actor, Omar Sharif (Lawrence of Arabia, Doctor Zhivago). The film illustrates the strong reaction of Romans and Jews from a political and religious standpoint, and it also deals with the immense obstacles Christianity encountered in the early stages of its development.

As a dedicated follower of Christ, Peter spreads the message of the Gospel across the land, often staying only one step ahead of those determined to persecute him. As the tension between Christians and Romans grows, blood runs in the streets. Peter and Paul meet and together they form a strong friendship in preaching about Christ.

This movie is not rated, but was created with an adult audience in mind. It may contain violence indicative of the life and times of the saint or character portrayed. We would recommend Parental Guidance and that parents preview it before watching with children.




