



**Special Mass Intentions** are offered to God as prayers of intercession and thanksgiving. In and through the Eucharist, we pray for the deceased, for those who are ill, for those who face various difficulties or challenges. Often, people request a Mass in thanksgiving for God's grace helping them through a particularly challenging time of life. It is important to note that, while the graces of the Mass being infinite, many intentions can be offered up at a single Mass. While a priest may only accept one intention at a single Mass, he may have many other intentions not attached to an offering. In addition, the faithful may bring their own intentions to the Mass, which they each carry privately and place upon the altar spiritually in prayer.

**Youth Population Declining in the U.S.: Mosher Calls Situation 'Dire'**

LIFESITE NEWS — The United States has 1.14 million fewer young people going into 2020, according to a report on the latest Census, and Population Research Institute President Steven Mosher calls the report a dire warning.

According to an article in *LifeSiteNews*, an analysis of new census data by the Brookings Institution's William Frey showed that while the adult population grew by 8.8 percent between 2010 and 2019, the youth population did not increase as it had in the three previous decades.

Instead, said the report, the “under 18” population nosedived in a state of “absolute decline” in the past decade.

“We need to turn this around, and quickly,,” Mosher told *LifeSiteNews*. “Children are the only future a family has. Indeed, they are the only future a nation has. And we are simply having too few children.

“We need to offer positive encouragement to young couples to get married and have children.”

His three-part solution is this: eliminate abortion, staunch the porn epidemic, and alleviate student debt, which leads to a delay in childbearing.

This epic film follows Karol Wojtyla's journey from his youth in Poland through his late days on the Chair of St. Peter. It explores his life behind the scenes: how he touched millions of people, changed the face of the Church and the world, and how he defended the dignity of mankind. Jon Voight's powerful, Emmy-nominated performance as John Paul II was widely praised, as was Cary Elwes as the young Karol. Shot on location in Rome and Poland in close connection with the Vatican, this is the definitive epic film on the life of Pope John Paul II. Stars Jon Voight, Cary Elwes, Ben Gazzara, James Cromwell, and Christopher Lee.

This movie is not rated, but was created with an adult audience in mind. It may contain violence indicative of the life and times of the saint or character portrayed. We would recommend Parental Guidance and that parents preview it before watching with children.

**Facebook censors pro-life group for 'false news'**

Facebook has censored pro-life group **Live Action**, claiming its content is "false news." Relying on the opinion of two abortion doctors, the social media giant labeled Live Action as "false" for airing a video promoting the perspective that abortion is "never medically necessary."

The two California based abortionists, Robyn Schickler and Daniel Grossman, claim abortion is a medically necessary procedure. As a result, Live Action stated it was notified that their pages' reach will be reduced for what Facebook called the "repeated sharing of false news."

Live Action founder and president Lila Rose responded to the allegations "With thousands of OB-GYNs and medical professionals on record agreeing with us that the direct killing of a child is never medically necessary, it is telling that Facebook decided to fact-check our information...using two abortionists for their sourcing."

"Continued efforts to censor Live Action will have tremendous implications," Rose added. "Not only for the pro-life movement, but for free speech in America." *christianpost.com 9/3/19*

**Parishes pray rosary for pro-life intentions throughout the year**

October is the month of the rosary and, in the U.S., it is also Respect Life Month. Since 2017, the Office of Formation in Discipleship, led by Deacon Mark Krejci, has organized a 40 Rosaries for Life Campaign. Parishes are assigned a day from Sept. 23 through Nov. 1 to pray the rosary with the intention of respect for life from conception to natural death. It has led to increased prayer for life in some parishes.

In October 2017, Father John Cox, OMI, led a Rosary for Life prayer service at St. Ann as part of the 40 Rosaries for Life initiative. Father Cox is Pastor of St. Ann, Waubun; St. Anne, Naytahwaush; and St. Frances Cabrini, Big Elbow Lake.

"The people who participated in it said, 'we'd like to do this every month', so we have, faithfully," Father Cox said. "We pray for life from conception to natural end, so it has not been single-issue focused, but it has been respect-life focused."

In preparation, Father Cox spends time prayerfully considering life issues and events throughout the world as well as the liturgical season while putting together a short meditation and specific intentions for each mystery of the rosary.

"It has been an important part of my life each month reflecting on what is happening in our local community, what's happening in the state and nation and how to thoughtfully bring it to prayer," he said. *By Katrina Genereux / Associate Editor, OND*
