




Knights of Columbus Mtg. - Sacred Heart March 15th

The Perfect Prayer of Thanksgiving

The most beautiful prayer of thanksgiving is the celebration of the Mass, an offering of praise to God our Father for having sent Jesus to sacrifice himself for us and for sharing his very self with us. In fact, the word "eucharist" comes from the Greek *eucharisto*, which means "thanksgiving."

The Catechism tells us that the Eucharist is not only "the sacrifice of praise in thanksgiving for the work of creation." In the Eucharistic sacrifice the whole of creation loved by God is presented to the Father though the death and the Resurrection of Christ. Through Christ the church can offer the sacrifice of praise in thanksgiving for all that God has made good, beautiful, and just in creation and in humanity. (1359)

Try this: next Sunday, keep your ears attuned to all the times the prayers of Mass offer thanksgiving and praise to God. As you do, enter into that attitude of thanksgiving yourself. Spend the hour at Mass thanking God for creating this beautiful world, for giving you life, for loving you, and for saving you from sin. Try to recall the many blessings he has poured out on you, especially the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

Next Session 5: The Seven Last Words Jesus the Teacher at Calvary

Now we turn our attention to what is commonly known as Christ's "Seven Last Words," which refers to the seven brief sayings Jesus uttered from the Cross before he died. For centuries, these words have been the subject of many sermons, books, devotions, and musical pieces. Think of these seven last words not merely as words spoken to the world in general, but as personal words spoken to you Before Jesus died, he was thinking of you and what you would be going through this year, this month, this day. He wants to give you a certain message to encourage you, or challenge you. AS St. Augustine once observed, "The tree upon which were fixed the members of Him dying was even the chair of the Master teaching."

FORMED.org PICK of the WEEK

The Sanctuary Course for Catholics — Misconceptions surrounding mental illness can prevent us from responding well to those suffering. This eight-session course explores the realities of mental illness, as well as the need for faith-based conversations about this topic. Featuring stories of Catholics living with mental health challenges, along with the insights of archbishops, theologians, and psychologists.

LEARN: A Bible Study on the Annunciation — In this video, Dr. Ben Akers leads us through a brief study of Luke 1:26-38, highlighting some of the key Old Testament passages evoked by Gabriel's words. The reflection concludes with some thoughts on how we can imitate Mary's Yes in our own life, especially in this time of suffering.

LISTEN: Say Yes to Christ: Allowing Jesus to be the Lord of your whole Life by Scott Hahn — Mary conformed the entirety of her life to the Divine Will. In doing so, she became the model of perfect discipleship. In this talk, Dr. Scott Hahn discusses why we too should surrender our lives to the Lord.
