



- 1. Seven students plus Carla Olsen will be attending the Steubenville in July. Still looking for more registrations for summer camps for middle school students.
- 2. Seven celebrated 1st Communion- RE classes done for this year -- planning for VBS in August -- looking into some family education nights this coming year.
- 3. 37 so far have signed up for the Mary's Mantle Marian Consecration. Looking at options for an intro. to the Bible this fall.
- 4. Going Forth As Disicples (GFAD) is working on a communication about the survey taken last spring -- looking at having persons share their faith story at Mass -- one per month.
- 5. Synod session at Roseau was a good experience. Diocese will put out a summary report on the twelve sessions held.

#### **Permanent Address**

One thing I ask from the Lord . . . that I may dwell in the house of the Lord. -- Psalm 27:4

Not long ago we moved to a new home just a short distance from our old one. Despite the close proximity, we still needed to load all of our belongings onto a moving truck because of the timing of the financial transactions. Between the sale and purchase, our furnishings stayed on the truck and our family found temporary lodging. During that time, I was surprised to discover how "at home" I felt despite the displacement from our physical home—simply because I was with those I love most: my family. For part of his life, David lacked a physical home. He lived life on the run from King Saul. As David was God's appointed successor to the throne, Saul perceived him as a threat and sought to kill him. David fled his home and slept wherever he found shelter. Though he had companions with him, David's most earnest desire was to "dwell in the house of the Lord"—to enjoy permanent fellowship with Him (Psalm 27:4).

Jesus is our constant companion, our sense of "home" no matter where we are. He's with us in our present troubles and even prepares a place for us to live with Him forever (John 14:3). Despite the uncertainty and change we might experience as citizens of this earth. we can dwell permanently in our fellowship with Him every day and everywhere. --- By **Kirsten Holmberg SCRIPTURE INSIGHT** 

Some of David's expressions of courage might leave the impression that he lived with the confidence that no harm or evil could touch him. Yet many of his songs, including Psalm 27, suggest that he knew what it meant to fear and tremble in the presence of his enemies (10:1; 13:1; 22:1–2). So, David's point is not that he's never desperately afraid. Rather, despite his fears, he acknowledges that his strength and hope are in God (27:9–14). Time after time, he senses enough danger to pray, "You have always been my helper. Don't leave me now; don't abandon me, O God of my salvation!" (v. 9). Because he knows that his enemies are still a force to be reckoned with, he reminds himself to "be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord" (v. 14).

#### Value of the Elderly

Pope Francis in late February began giving a new series of catechetical talks on the value of the elderly during his Wednesday general audiences. His insights on aging are not only profound and practical, but also sorely needed in our society. Here are some highlights: "There is a lack of encouragement for people to seek [the elderly] out, and there is a lack



of education for the community to recognize them. In short, for an age that is now a decisive part of the community space and extends to a third of the entire lifespan, there are — at times — care plans, but not projects of existence. Care plans, yes; but not plans to let them live to the full. And this is a void of thought, of imagination and of creativity" (Feb. 23).

"A society in which the elderly do not speak with the young, the young do not speak with the elderly, adults do not speak with neither the elderly nor young people, is a sterile society, without a future, a society that does not look to the horizon but rather looks at itself. And it becomes lonely. May God help us find the right music for this harmonious relationship among the various ages: the little ones, elderly, adults, everyone together: a beautiful symphony of dialogue" (March 2).

"What is the meaning of my old age? ... The meaning is this: being a prophet of corruption and saying to others: 'Stop, I have taken this path and it does not lead you anywhere! Now I will tell you about my experience" (March 16).

"An old age that is granted this clarity is a precious gift for the generation that is to follow. Listening personally and directly to the story of lived faith, with all its highs and lows, is irreplaceable" (March 23).

"Old age that has cultivated the sensitivity of the soul extinguishes all envy between generations. ... This is what happens to an elderly person who is open to a young person who is open: he or she bids farewell to life while, so to speak, handing over life to the new generation" (March 30).

Life Leadership Camp is MCCL's pro-life summer camp for H.S. students or those entering college this fall. The camp takes place Aug. 7-10, 2022, at Koronis Ministries in Paynesville, MN The camp offers four days of pro-life education including guest speakers and sessions covering topics relating to abortion and other pro-life issues. It equips students to make a difference in their schools and communities doing so in a summer camp environment with games and fun outdoor activities. Cost is \$100 per student and includes meals, accommodations, materials, and a T-shirt; scholarships may also be available. On-line registration now open or call MCCL office.
