
Increase in suggest offered for a Mass Intention

In line with most other dioceses the suggested offering for **Mass intentions after July 1 will be \$10.00.** However the amount offered will always be according to one's ability and not mandatory. One of the reasons for the offering is that it is one way to "participate" in the prayers offered for requested intention. At one time the offering very much helped support the priest offering the Mass. That is not the case today unless the Mass request is sent to missionary priests or retired priests who have no or limited income for their support.

We are preparing, little by little, for our upcoming move from Memorial Drive to Summit Avenue in the middle part of July. More information will be forthcoming. Please continue to pray for our transition, our hiring processes for new operations staff, and the Sisters of Saint Benedict. Because of the generosity of so many, especially our parishes, it looks like we will make our \$9 million goal to have cash on hand to pay for the building by July 1. We will still owe more to the Sisters over the next 18 months and we are still working on the \$3 million endowment needed to run the building. But **God is providing and so are you, thank you.**


YOUTH MINISTRY

Pastoral / Financial Council Mtg. June 22nd

1. Emily Burkel is at St. Theresa of Calcutta Camp (Gr. 9-10) at Bemidji this week
2. Returning to kneeling at Mass after the Lamb of God.
3. MN Bishops website (mncatholic.org) is concerned with abortion decision and gun violence.
4. Oiland Lutheran supper this Friday - 4-7:00 pm , Greenbush
5. Badger Community Picnic - Thurs. Aug. 4 -- 6 pm.
6. Latest financial reports show that to keep up with inflation and increased expenses we need all parishioners to increase regular contributions by 6-10% to balance our budget.
7. Still working at Roseau on a tri-parish stewardship renewal program.
8. At the moment the stock market is not stable, but if we were to invest a portion of long-term funds with the diocesan Catholic Community Foundation we could expect a 6-7 % return, with no investment fees and ease to deposit or remove funds as needed. We are looking into this.
9. Waiting for Sarah and Phyllis to go through environment and decoration materials and let us know what kind and how much shelving they need for the middle room. It is unsafe to bring items up and down from the attic and some things might go into the basement storage.
10. Agreed to go ahead with summer-fill of propane.
11. Mike Whitt's term is up and open for a second term if he chooses. Trustees also need to be appointed or reappointed this fall. +Alroy Monsrud's seat on PC remains unfilled.
12. Will talk with Jim Dostal about programmable thermostats.
13. Will install a water faucet on the west side of the church.
14. Will talk with parents of young children, but are thinking that to start with we just run a speaker to the classrooms so parents needing to take children out of Mass could still hear the Mass.
15. Fr. John applied for a grant from the diocese for a television monitor and a small laptop for education use.
16. Next meeting: Wed. Aug. 24 at 6:30 PM.

GROW IN YOUR FAITH

Prayer + Fasting + Almsgiving

Prayer: at 3:00 pm each Friday pray the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Holy Rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet.

Fasting: it is suggested that we eat no more than one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. It is also permissible to attempt a strict fast. A penitents age and health should always be taken into consideration before fasting.

Almsgiving: giving alms is a "work of justice pleasing to God" (Catechism of the Catholic Church). Each Friday we should donate money or goods to the poor or perform another act of charity.
