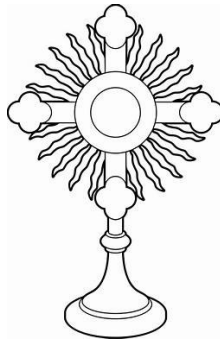

## Accepting the Christian Message

Jesus said to the disciples, "Whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near.'" -Luke 10:10-11

**Adults:** where do you see the message of Christian faith being rejected in the world today? What is your response to that?

**Children:** what can you do when you are generous with others, and they do not want what you give them?

## Fourth of July Reflection (AFA Journal)

Surely most Americans are aware that the American Revolutionary War was fought in the late 18th century between American colonists and the armies of Great Britain. However, many are unaware that, around the same time period, the French were staging a revolution of their own. This historical coincidence provides an astonishing comparison between two nations and the differences in their foundations.

"America's system is built on liberty from God, and therefore lived out respecting His authority" said Rick Green of the Patriot Academy.

"The French said, "We want freedom, we want liberty, but we don't want God, and we don't want religion." So it led to total chaos, and it did not work. The difference is they removed God from the equation."

This comparison highlights the origins of American greatness, roots that citizens desperately need to remember today. However, the current state of American culture is one that has collectively disregarded what made America great in the first place.

"These rights do not come from the government," Green explained. "They come from God, and that separates our system from other systems in history. If you have a freedom of religion or freedom of speech or freedom of assembly, but it's given by government, then the government can take it away whenever they want based on anything that they want.

Thankfully, these rights are not dependent on human institutions.

"If your freedom comes directly from God . . . which is the way our Declaration described our whole system," Green explained, "then the government is accountable to you, and your rights don't change based on the winds, based on the fads of the day. Your rights are inherent because God gave them to you, and He doesn't change. Unfortunately, the principle of God-given rights is missing from our educational formation.

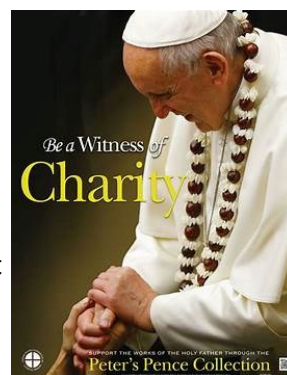

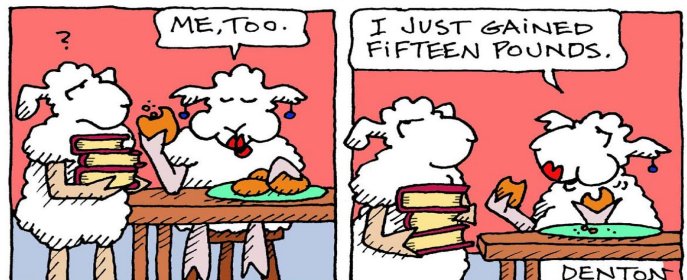

1. Carla O. and 6 students will attend Steubenville Youth Conference in St. Paul - July 28-31.
2. VBS set for Aug. 1-3 with a family kickoff on Sun., July 31. We plan to have a family RE night event in the fall and in the spring this year along with regular classes.
3. The Mary's Mantle consecration had participation from over 30 persons from our 3 parishes. We will ask them to share a bit of their faith story at Masses over the coming year.
4. Have 7 new altar servers and are working on adding a few persons in other liturgical ministries.


### Formed.org Pick of the Week

### MN's Bishops Respond to Dobbs v. Jackson Decision

Along with women and men across our nation who respect the inherent dignity of each human life, the Catholic bishops of Minnesota give thanks to God on this historic day as the Supreme Court ends the injustice of the Roe v. Wade decision. We are grateful that the Supreme Court has returned to state Legislatures and federal officials the ability to protect preborn children and save mothers and fathers from the untold pain of abortion. For almost 50 years, Roe grievously denied one of America's founding principles: that all men and women—irrespective of their stage of development—are created equal, with God-given rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. Forgetting this self-evident truth has resulted in the death of over 60 million preborn children and the wounding of millions of mothers and fathers.

### Welcomed in Life

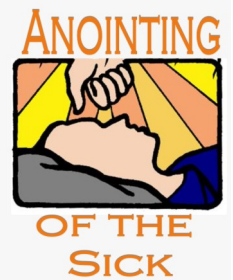
As a Church, we have been committed to providing help to every mother and father dealing with a crisis pregnancy, so they are not forced to choose abortion. We are proud that many of our Catholic faithful work in crisis pregnancy centers that create non-judgmental networks of support for women. These centers offer shelter, housing assistance, free diapers and clothing, pregnancy and parenting classes, community referrals, childcare, and other charitable assistance. Through our continued efforts to respect the well-being of both the mother and the child, we have been honored to accompany countless women and men tempted to choose abortion. We have been privileged as well, through post-abortion healing retreats, to help parents who have chosen abortion to work through the pain they so often suffer.

### Anointing of the Sick

*Jesus came to heal the whole person, body and soul.*

Through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. His cures were signs of the arrival of the Kingdom of God. The core message of his healing tells us of his plan to conquer sin and death by his dying and rising.

When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age. ~ *United States Catholic Catechism for Adults*
