"...For his sake I have accepted the loss of all things and I consider them so much rubbish, that I may gain Christ..." (PHILIPPIANS 3:8)





Focus on the Family & Vocations The shortage is becoming severe. We have only a couple of religious women still serving in our parishes. Our 33 current priest, including 8 on loan, 10 will retire in the next decade. We do not have a priest





we will have about 25 priests to staff 66 parishes (currently staffed by 33 priests).

Response 1– carry out our mission with fewer priests that will impact where and when Masses are held.

Response 2– increase our efforts in promoting voations of priesthood or consecrated to life to our young people.
