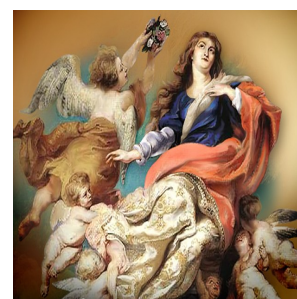

Religious Ed Update

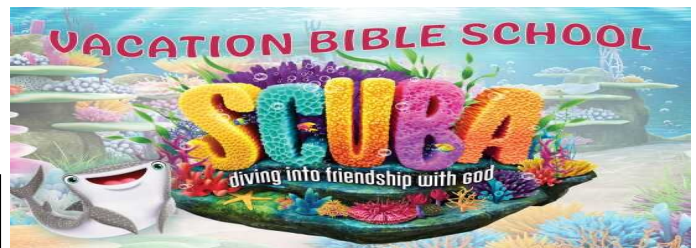

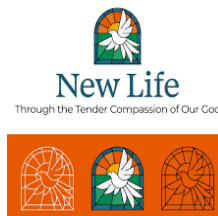

Begin a dialog about parish planning with key stakeholders across the diocese: We will begin
