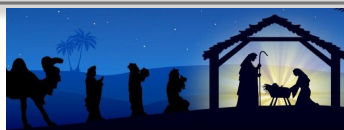

Epiphany of the Lord

"Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." MATTHEW 2:11

SACRAMENTS

If you would like to inquire or receive a Sacrament, please contact **Fr. James 218.463.2441**.

- **Baptism:** Beginning of spiritual life, freed from original sin and any personal sin. (John 3:5)
- **Matrimony:** **Contact Fr. James 6 mos. prior to prepare.** Priest unites man and woman together (Matthew 19:6)
- **Anointing of the Sick:** Call for the priests of the Church and have them pray and anoint them with the oil in the name of the Lord. Prayers of the faithful will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven." The Church has the great challenge of continuing the work of Jesus' healing in the world. Please know of the Church's prayers for you and the one you love who is ill.
- **Holy Communion:** Receiving the body & blood of Jesus allows us to grow closer to him. (John 6:56)
- **Reconciliation:** God forgives and fills us with grace and joy that help to lead us away from sin. (Mark 2:5)
- **Confirmation:** Bishop anoints using "chrism" oil while the gifts of the Holy Spirit are received. (John 20:22)
- **Holy Orders:** Men are ordained (Bishop, Priest, Deacon) and receive grace and power to serve God.

PARISH PLANNING FOR MISSION

Phase 1: Discernment and Decisions

During this phase, pastors, parishioners, and parish representatives prayerfully consider different possible configurations for parishes, such as clustering or merger, and identify opportunities for collaboration. This phase culminates in a pastoral rational given by the representatives of each parish to the Diocesan Planning Commission and then they will make recommendations to the bishop for him to consider.

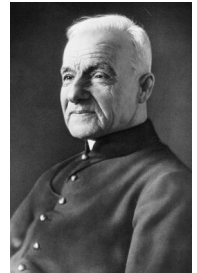

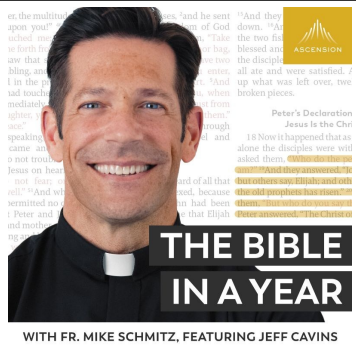
