SACRAMENTS

If you would like to inquire or receive a Sacrament, please contact **Fr. James 218.463.2441**.

- **Baptism:** Beginning of spiritual life, freed from original sin and any personal sin. (John 3:5)
- **Matrimony:** **Contact Fr. James 6 mos. prior to prepare.** Priest unites man and woman together (Matthew 19:6)
- **Anointing of the Sick:** Call for the priests of the Church and have them pray and anoint them with the oil in the name of the Lord. Prayers of the faithful will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven." The Church has the great challenge of continuing the work of Jesus' healing in the world. Please know of the Church's prayers for you and the one you love who is ill.
- **Holy Communion:** Receiving the body & blood of Jesus allows us to grow closer to him. (John 6:56)
- **Reconciliation:** God forgives and fills us with grace and joy that help to lead us away from sin. (Mark 2:5)
- **Confirmation:** Bishop anoints using "chrism" oil while the gifts of the Holy Spirit are received. (John 20:22)
- **Holy Orders:** Men are ordained (Bishop, Priest, Deacon) and receive grace and power to serve God.

Have you thought about attending the upcoming precinct caucuses? This year in Minnesota is a big election year. We will elect a new Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, State Auditor, one U.S. Senator, all eight U.S. Representatives, and the entire State Legislature! This means we have a lot of opportunity to help shape the common good in our society.

On February 3, our state will hold caucuses in every precinct. Precinct caucuses are a great way to exercise your civic engagement by becoming involved in the political process. Caucuses are often the first step in nominating candidates, discussing issues, and shaping the local party's platform. Attending a precinct caucus for a particular party does not equate to a party or candidate endorsement. Catholics can simply show up, bring resolutions, and help shape the party's platform.

3. Show up: Have fun and enjoy participating in your civic duty as a Catholic. Your presence truly matters.
