everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish? Or hand him a scorpion when he asks for an egg? If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"



Because the words of The Lord's Prayer are often prayed by Christians, they may become "ho-hum" and lack inspiration for us. Some time ago, I became aware of the immense challenge and opportunity held in a particular part of this well-known prayer: "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." Since then, when I join in praying the Our Father, I close my eyes and open my hands as a symbol of my willingness to change my heart. I often feel a momentary tug inside of me when I speak those words. In a blink, I become aware of both the requirement to forgive and the recognition of anyone I might yet need to release from my strong hold on hurt. Reciting this prayer happens quickly during worship, but just as quickly, a bit more release flows through my begrudging heart.

Pope St. John Paul II Miracles

Pope St. John Paul is such a powerful intercessor, and these miracles prove that!

First Approved Miracle Leading to Beatification

"The first miracle that made him a Blessed was the remission of Parkinson's Disease in a French nun, (Sr. Marie Simon-Pierre). "John Paul suffered from Parkinson's. He suffered heroically with it." "Very shortly after his death, Sr. Simon-Pierre prayed to John Paul II, and her Parkinson's was completely alleviated and gone."

Second Approved Miracle Leading to St. John Paul's Canonization

"The second miracle leading to St. John Paul's canonization occurred through a Costa Rican woman named Floribeth Mora." *She had an inoperable brain aneurysm that doctors* said there was nothing they could do about it, so she was basically dribbling out the clock waiting to die. Mora was bedridden and couldn't really do anything. While reading a

magazine with Pope John Paul II on the cover, the image John Paul II spoke to her!

The image said, 'Floribeth, what are you doing in bed? Why don't you get up and go into the kitchen and see your husband? From the image, the Pope's bands seemed to reach out to her in a loving way. Mora responded, 'Okay, I will. I feel fine right now.' And she got up went into the kitchen, talked to her husband, and that was it. She was healed!

She said, 'I felt a great sense of wellness inside of me and from that day on, I was completely healed.'

People thought she was crazy, so the word got to the religious superiors and they arranged for her to go to a hospital in Rome. They disguised her as a Costa Rican tourist. This was all done very clandestine. The doctors said 'No ma'am we don't see any activity of a brain aneurysm. There's nothing here. You're good to go home.'

She was at the canonization of Pope John Paul II. How incredible! ~Fr. Rich Pagano
