

ACCREDITATION

Accreditation plays an important role in supporting and validating the mission and excellence of Catholic schools.

Catholic schools in the state of Texas are accredited through the Texas Catholic Conference of Bishops Education Department (TCCB ED). TCCB ED uses several guiding documents to create their standards including the National Standards and Benchmarks for Effective Catholic Elementary and Secondary Schools (NSBECS) and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) recommendations of Church doctrine related to elementary and secondary Catholic schools.

The accreditation cycle is a seven-year process that culminates in a yearlong self-study for each school, followed by an accreditation visit that serves to acknowledge and support the strengths and areas of continuous improvement each school has identified in the self-study process.



During the 2022-2023 school year, three schools were visited by an accreditation team:

- Santa Cruz Catholic School, Buda
- St. Ignatius Martyr Catholic School Austin

Holy Trinity Catholic High School's Senior class has been accepted to 30 different colleges and universities, with combined scholarship offerings of \$1.659.821.








St. Mary's Catholic School, Taylor

Teachers and staff are an essential part of the success of our Catholic schools, which is why the Office of Catholic Schools continues to provide opportunities for professional development for teachers and staff. In the 2022-2023 academic year, two particular initiatives continued to flourish:

Leadership Academy

Cohort 3 of the Leadership Academy completed an 18-month discernment journey and formation, which provided a unique experience for educators interested in pursuing a career in Catholic School Leadership.



Classroom Learning Lab

Six teachers from different Catholic schools across the diocese explored and practiced the craft of teaching in a supportive and mission-driven environment. This consisted of observing each other teach, sharing best practices, and providing constructive feedback to continually improve and expand their teaching methodologies.



In addition to the Level II religious education certification requirement for all religion teachers in the Diocese of Austin Catholic schools, Level I religious education certification is required for all teachers who serve our students. This Level I certification provides a foundation and basic knowledge of our Catholic faith for all teachers so their subject areas can be supported through the lens of the Church. Every teacher who teaches in our Catholic schools, whether Catholic or non-Catholic, is on a walk with our Lord that deserves to be nourished and encouraged.

With the support of the Office of Catholic Schools, each school ensures that school life and learning are focused on the foundation of Catholic education: teaching, worship, community and service.



Teaching – living Gospel values, preserving and passing on the traditions, beliefs and culture of the Catholic faith which are the heart of each school's curriculum and activities.



Worship - regularly celebrated liturgy, prayer and prayer services in the Catholic tradition.



Community - the total life of the school reflects the commitment to the faith development of each person, and a genuine respect for every individual.



Service – opportunities for faith-in-action are provided that are consistent with Catholic social teaching and serve as a witness of faith to the communities served by the schools.



This past year, and in honor of the National Eucharistic Revival movement, eight of our Catholic middle schools (more than 400 teens) came together for a day of fellowship, encounter, and spiritual renewal. The middle school Eucharistic Rally offered students an opportunity to grow in their relationship with Christ in the Eucharist. The schedule of the day included a dynamic presentation from Catholic speaker Paul J. Kim, Mass celebrated by Bishop Joe Vásquez, and concluded with Holy Hour in front of the Blessed Sacrament. The rally was such a success that another one is in the works for this academic year.



Catholic Advocacy Day took place in 2023 at the Texas Capitol, and hundreds of our Catholic school students participated in the day's activities - which included mock trial hearings, Bishop's rally, and visiting with local representatives. We are so proud of our students for practicing faithful citizenship.


ACADEMICS


Effective Catholic schools exhibit a clear mission, a strong Catholic identity, a safe and orderly learning environment, and academic excellence. The hallmark of a Catholic school education has been challenging programs offered in an atmosphere that models Gospel values and supports and enhances the development of the whole child.

Assessment

All Catholic schools in the Diocese of Austin use the NWEA MAP Assessments in 1st through 8th grade. With three testing windows each year, these adaptive assessments allow teachers and administrators to monitor student growth in the areas of Reading, Language Usage, Mathematics, and Science. Information about individual student growth, campus grade level growth, and diocesan-wide student growth informs instruction that can target both student weaknesses and enrichment for areas of strength.

The two charts below compare Diocese of Austin's NWEA MAP reading and math assessment averages with the national average and the averages of other Catholic schools, both nationally and within the state of Texas. The averages for the Diocese of Austin reflect the 2022-2023 school year. All other averages were taken from the 2021-2022 school year, which is the most recent school year that national and state NWEA averages are available. Any comparable change in averages between the two school years is anticipated to be statistically insignificant.

St. Thomas Aquinas Mass

The annual Catholic Schools St. Thomas Aquinas Mass recognizes middle school students for their leadership and service to the community, as well as high school students for being named National Merit Scholars.

This year's celebration took place on March 1, 2023, at St. Louis Catholic Church and School in Austin, where 60 middle school students and 48 high school students were honored.

ACCESSIBILITY

In an effort to continue fostering opportunities for more families to explore Catholic education by making it more accessible, Catholic Schools in the Diocese of Austin partnered with ACE Scholarships, Our Kids at Heart Foundation, and the Catholic Foundation - Diocese of Austin.



ACE Scholarships

support new families who meet specific income guidelines. Once the student qualifies for a scholarship, the funds can be renewed each year up to 12th grade. In 2022-2023, ACE awarded 96 scholarships for a total of \$256,000 to students in Catholic Schools in the Diocese of Austin.



Our Kids at Heart Foundation (OKAH)

provides tuition support to 172 economically disadvantaged students from parishes in Central Texas. OKAH intentionally partners with parishes and families in Austin, Taylor, Bryan, and Temple.



The Catholic Foundation - Diocese

of Austin houses many endowments for Catholic schools, which in turn provide financial support for our students. In 2022-2023 academic year, the foundation distributed \$133,495 to schools for tuition assistance.



Pastors and parish communities in the Diocese of Austin are also valuable partners in making Catholic education more accessible to more families in Central Texas.



Catholic school donors are generous individuals and organizations that believe in the transformative power of Catholic education and choose to support it.




2023 SAINTS & SCHOLARS

The annual Saints & Scholars, Celebrating Catholic Schools Gala celebrates Catholic education in the Diocese of Austin while honoring the "unsung" heroes at each of our 19 Catholic schools, and raises much-needed funds that are returned to each school in support of their tuition assistance programs for students and their families.

This past year, we celebrated the 15th anniversary of this grand event, and Mother Amata Veritas, O.P., Prioress General, Dominican Sisters of Mary, Mother of the Eucharist was the keynote speaker for the evening. Thanks to your support and generosity, we were able to raise \$150,000 that went back to the schools, and since 2009, over \$1.8 million has been raised at this event.
