FIRST READING:

Joshua 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b

Joshua gathered together all the tribes of Israel at Shechem, summoning their elders, their leaders, their judges, and their officers. When they stood in ranks before God, Joshua addressed all the people: "If it does not please you to serve the LORD, decide today whom you will serve, the gods your fathers served beyond the River or the gods of the Amorites in whose country you are now dwelling. 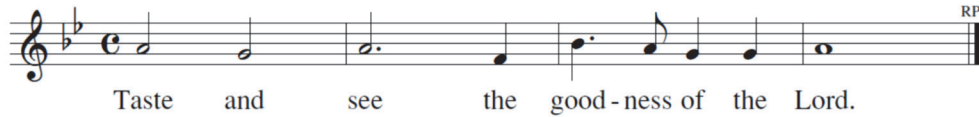

SECOND READING:

Ephesians 5:21-32

Brothers and sisters: Be subordinate to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives should be subordinate to their husbands as to the Lord. For the husband is head of his wife just as Christ is head of the church, he himself the savior of the body. As the church is subordinate to Christ, so wives should be subordinate to their husbands in everything. Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the church and handed himself over for her to sanctify her, cleansing her by the bath of water with the word, that he might present to himself the church in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. So also husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one hates his own flesh but rather nourishes and cherishes it, even as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body. For this reason a man shall leave his father and his mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. This is a great mystery, but I speak in reference to Christ and the church.

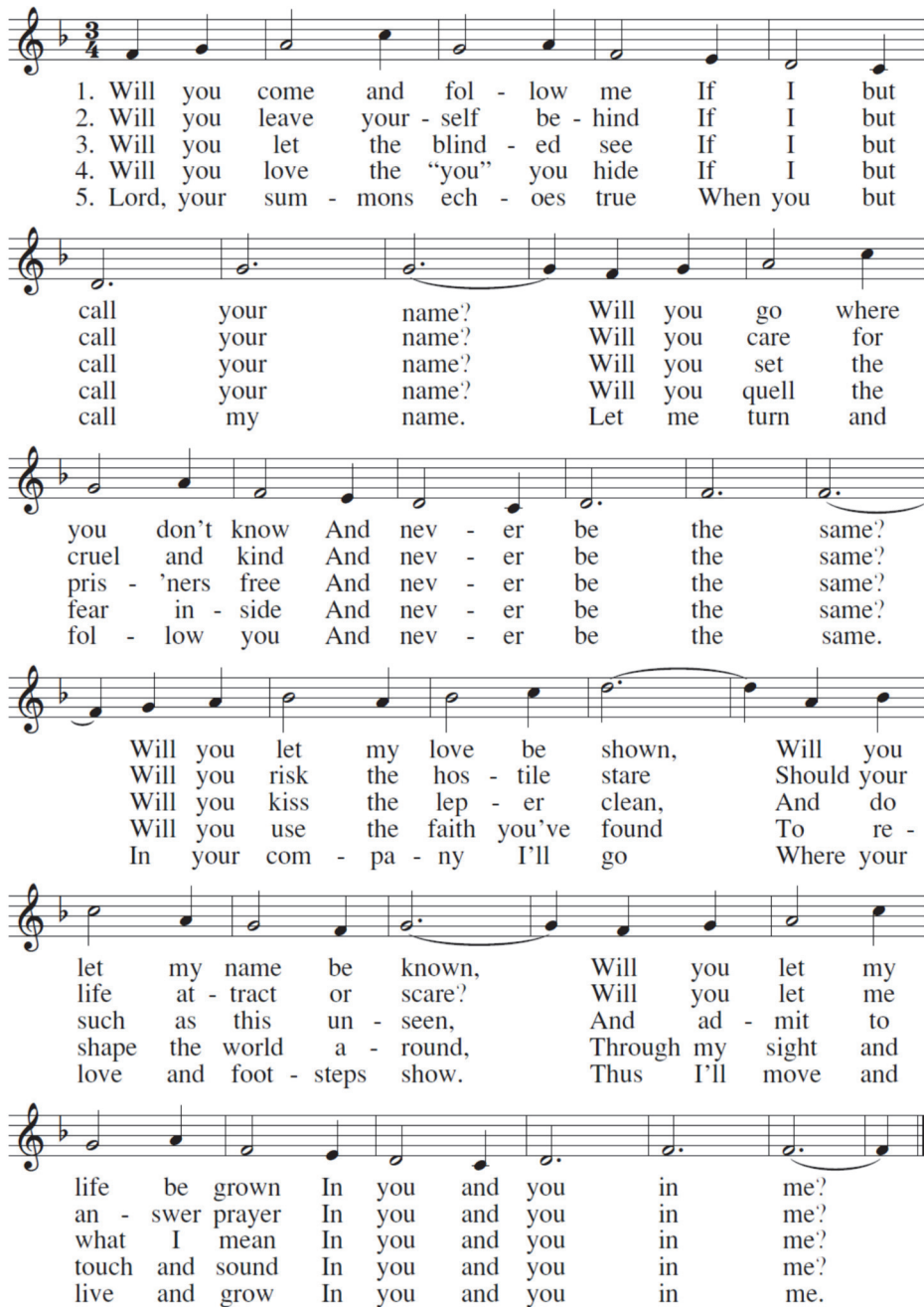

Many of Jesus' disciples who were listening said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" Since Jesus knew that his disciples were murmuring about this, he said to them, "Does this shock you? The people rise and reply: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all His holy Church.

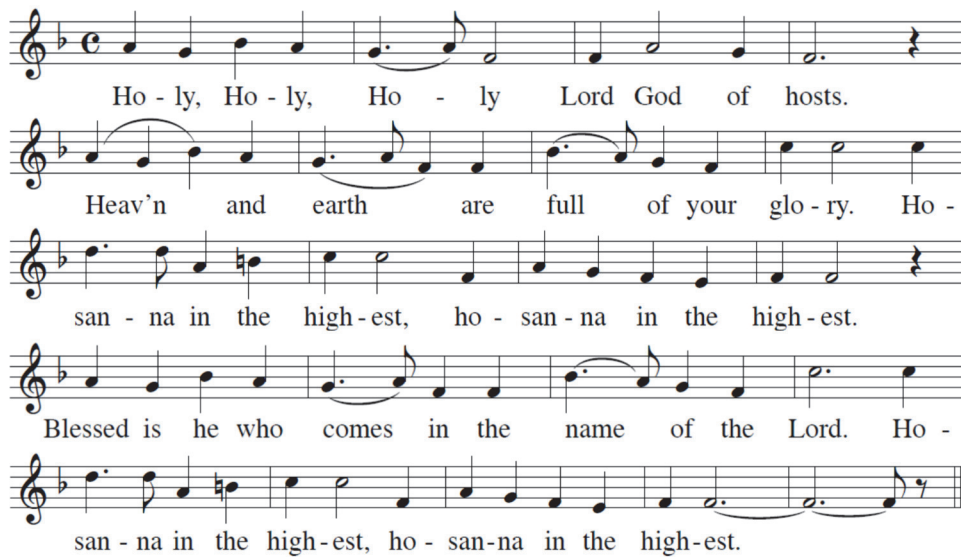

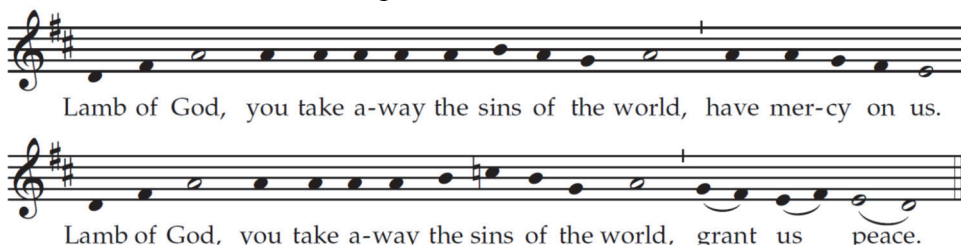

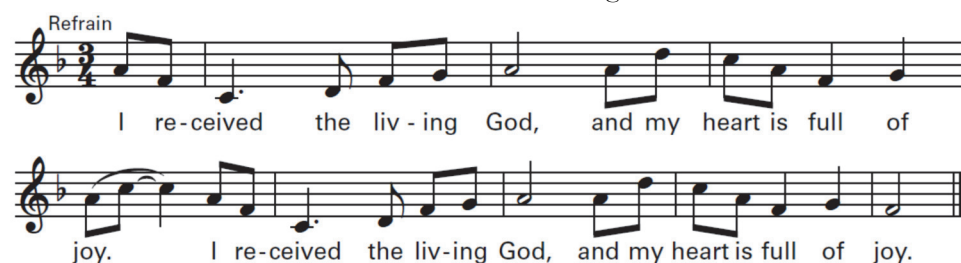

FROM the PASTOR'S DESK ...

Over the past few weeks, we have been considering the subject of "holiness." Recently we have certainly seen examples of what holiness is not. But what are some contemporary examples of holiness? Of what does modern holiness consist?

FOCUS is "The Fellowship of Catholic University Students." FOCUS is a group of young people who are passionate about changing the world and helping other young people live a life of purpose. They are on college campuses across the country.

Their founder is Curtis Martin. When speaking to college students he says, "You are made for greatness. You are made for relationship. You are made for adventure. You are made for joy. You are made for more." Curtis had the rare opportunity to meet Pope St. John Paul II and express to him the hope and vision he had for FOCUS. The Pope listened carefully and simply told Curtis, "Be soldiers."

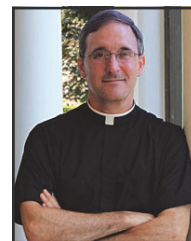
FOCUS missionaries are young adults whose lives have been transformed through an encounter with Jesus Christ. They sign up to live on a college campus for a few years and re-propose the gospel of Jesus Christ to a young generation in a way that is relevant to everyday life. Since 1998, they have grown from two missionaries on one campus to more than 550 missionaries on 125 campuses.

Something is happening. Is this what "holiness" looks like?

Consider what FOCUS says about themselves on their website:

"The Mission: College graduates are launched into every other point in our culture: families, parishes, communities, and workplaces. It is during college where the character of the next generation of leaders is formed. We put all our efforts on the college campus because the university is the most strategic place to transform the world. Each year, teams of FOCUS missionaries are sent to college campuses at the invitation of the local bishop and with the support of the local campus ministry."

Their Method of Evangelization has three components: *(Continued on Page 4)*

WIN: Through authentic friendships that foster an encounter with Jesus Christ, FOCUS draws people into a covenantal relationship with God. FOCUS goes out to meet students wherever they may be on campus — in the dorms, on the fields, in the student union — so that we may invite those students to find the greater meaning of their lives.

BUILD: Once we have encountered others in friendship, we invite them to go deeper. We form students through Bible studies and one-on-one discipleship so that they may possess the hearts, minds, and habits of joyful, disciplined followers of Jesus. We teach them to pray with Scripture, to participate in the sacraments and to pursue lives of virtue and excellence so that they can become all that God is calling them to be.

SEND: While FOCUS walks alongside people on discipleship, we likewise invite them to imitate Jesus and to be Spirit-filled evangelists by going on to win, build and send others. Those who have been sent strive to live out lifelong mission wherever the Lord leads them, sharing the good news with their friends, families, communities, workplaces, and parishes across the nation.

This is not your regular 9-5. This is a life-changing mission. This is what holiness looks like "lived." The missionaries say that the best part of what they do is that they get to do this together. Holiness is never done by Lone-Rangers. It always involves connections and community. Guided by the Holy Spirit, they work as one family to bring hope to the world.
