I am working on a Support Team to help. The hard part is that I really do not know when all this will be happening. Right now my kidneys are working, not strongly, but they are working. I am trying to be extra good and watch my intake and what I am eating and drinking. One thing I ask is for your prayers as I continue to go through this process. I am starting to feel a little stronger and have some more energy.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

October 17-18, 2020 | All Masses

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Next weekend in union with the whole Church, we will celebrate World Mission Sunday. This observance, instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1926 reminds Catholics about their commitment to support the missionary work of the Church through prayer and sacrifice. The call has intensified this year due to the serious difficulties which so many people are experiencing due to the pandemic. Pope Francis reflects on this during his message on World Mission Sunday earlier this year:

"In this year marked by the suffering and challenges created by the Covid-19 pandemic, the missionary journey of the whole Church continues in light of the words found in the account of the calling of the prophet Isaiah: 'Here am I, send me' (6:8). This is the ever new response to the Lord's question: "Whom shall I send?" (ibid.) This invitation from God's merciful heart challenges both the Church and humanity as a whole in the current world crisis. In this context the invitation to step out of ourselves for love of God and neighbor, presents itself as an opportunity for sharing, service, and intercessory prayer. The mission that God entrusts to each one of us leads us from fear and introspection to a renewed realization that we find ourselves precisely when we give ourselves to others."

Next weekend, October 17-18, we will have a concrete opportunity to support the missionary work of the Church throughout the world through the annual collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. This collection supports mission dioceses in Africa, Asia, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe, where priests, religious and lay leaders serve the world's most vulnerable communities. Please keep the Pope's missionary efforts in your prayers and give generously to next week's collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith.
