

BAPTISMS take place on the last Sunday of the month and are to be arranged after the birth of your child with one of the Parish Priests. Families must be registered members of ICC. Should a family not be registered, a three month waiting period will be expected. Godparents are required to obtain Sponsor certificates from their home parish.

MARRIAGES Couples wishing to be married at ICC should consist of at least one registered, practicing parishioner of the Parish, or be registered, active parishioners at another Catholic Church, with at least one having a close tie to our Parish. Per Archdiocesan regulations, Catholic members of the couple who are not registered and active members of ICC will be required to bring documentation of their religious status from the home parish where they are registered. Marriages are arranged a minimum of six months before the proposed date, directly with one of the Parish Priests. Pre-Cana must be completed. All additional necessary papers must be submitted in a timely fashion.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK is a Sacrament for the physically ill, those burdened by age, anticipating surgery, or near death. Please call the Rectory to arrange an Anointing.



So most of the late night hosts see no connection with the killer's relationship and the murder of Charlie Kirk. Talking heads on the news echo the same sentiment. They are all trying to separate this murder from the groups they are involved in. They probably never heard about the armed wing of the movement at the heart of this event. Right!

Made body and soul, we are created good. Yes, there is a "normal". There was a time, not too long ago, that denied "normal" because it was hurtful. You couldn't even buy shampoo for "normal" hair! Normal, reflects accepted norms or conditions for the majority of people. That sentence is problematic for the 4% and the .004% of the population who desperately want us to see deviant and sinful behavior as "normal".

For years, TV shows, commercials, and movies have tried to normalize behavior that for millennia has been considered abnormal. In some cultures and societies, certain practices were seen as accepted deviant behavior, think ancient Rome or Greece. That immorality and accepted perverse behavior, would lead to the end of those civilizations. The same happened with Heavy Metal in our own time. Its own excesses led to the total rejection of that musical genre.

Hatred now knows no bounds or logical reason. Now, thanks to the influence of Progressive-Marxist thought, words are seen as a weapon, and most young people, under 39, believe that you can hurt someone, cancel someone, or kill someone if their opinion or position is contrary to theirs. To dance at the announcement of Charlie Kirk's murder is sick and depraved. There is the popular phrase "hate speech" that is being used as a weapon against free speech. And this is at the core of the First Amendment: we are guaranteed the ability to speak freely, that which we believe, even if we disagree or find that speech disgusting. The caveat is, when speech motivates hateful action or a violent reaction, then it is no longer protected by the First Amendment. Attorney General Bondi got caught on this very slippery slope. The First Amendment protects the speech we don't like.

When speech demeans the humanity of another, and arguments become ad hominem, rather than facts, opinions and ideologies, we have crossed the Rubicon of civil discourse. If this mind frame existed 249 years ago, we wouldn't have a Country. They talked, they disagreed, they screamed, -they compromised.

We are going to disagree. I like oatmeal, you like farina. I'm a Catholic, I'm an atheist. The advantage we have, is that we are called to see each other as brothers and sisters. If we are successful in that, we can't hate, wish evil or kill. Wish that more churches, pastors and clergy would address hatred. But why teach Christ's teachings when they have their own always "correct opinion". It's easier.







Answer...

St. Francis of Assisi is considered the first recorded individual to receive the stigmata, the wounds of Christ's Crucifixion. He experienced these stigmatical marks in 1224 at La Verna, Italy, which were later confirmed on his body after his death. While there are historical figures like St. Paul who may have referred to suffering that could be interpreted as a form of stigmata, St. Francis' experience is the first documented case.

Also known as asters, these flowers symbolize protection and the changing season. Use them to beautify your home and honor the Archangels.




