BAPTISMS take place on the last Sunday of the month and are to be arranged after the birth of your child with one of the Parish Priests. Families must be registered members of ICC. Should a family not be registered, a three month waiting period will be expected. Godparents are required to obtain Sponsor certificates from their home parish.

MARRIAGES Couples wishing to be married at ICC should consist of at least one registered, practicing parishioner of the Parish, or be registered, active parishioners at another Catholic Church, with at least one having a close tie to our Parish. Per Archdiocesan regulations, Catholic members of the couple who are not registered and active members of ICC will be required to bring documentation of their religious status from the home parish where they are registered. Marriages are arranged a minimum of six months before the proposed date, directly with one of the Parish Priests. Pre-Cana must be completed. All additional necessary papers must be submitted in a timely fashion.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK is a Sacrament for the physically ill, those burdened by age, anticipating surgery, or near death. Please call the Rectory to arrange an Anointing.



"War is Hell!" And it is. Two opposing parties that have the death of the other as their primary goal and mission, is a guarantee of nothing but suffering, the death of innocents, starvation, indiscriminate violence, abuse, and destruction. So, does that mean every war, every move towards violence is evil? Let's explore.

The Church has always had a just war theory, that allowed the oppressed to fight for freedom. It allows those attacked unjustly, to fight back to be free. The Old Testament contains numerous examples of divinely sanctioned warfare. In Exodus 15:3, God is described as "a man of war," affirming that war, under certain conditions, is not inherently evil. In the New Testament, while our Lord Jesus Christ teaches peace and love of enemies (cf. Matthew 5:44), He does not condemn soldiers for their profession. When the centurion approaches Jesus in Matthew 8:5-13, Our Lord praises his faith without requiring him to abandon his role.

- St. Thomas Aquinas systematized the Church's teaching on Just War in Summa Theologiae, II-II, q. 40, De bello. He laid out three essential conditions for a war to be just:
- 1. Legitimate Authority (auctoritas principis): War must be declared by a lawful sovereign, not by private individuals.
- 2. Just Cause (causa iusta): There must be a real and grave reason, such as defense against aggression or rectification of grave injustice.
- 3. Right Intention (intentio recta): The goal must be to advance good or avoid evil, not vengeance or conquest.

On the human side, there are those who answer the call and the need for a defense against the evil one. There are wars that America has engaged in that have been clearly just, which makes the modern anti-Semitic movement such an affront. There have been wars and conflicts that we have gotten involved in with less than optimum results. The actuality of war, involves real people who are asked to see things that no man should see. They are asked to lay down their lives, if necessary, for a just cause. We can debate the definition of just, but that doesn't change the reality that we have sent our sons and daughters, brothers and sisters to serve our Nation.

That is why, the anti-American tone in our Country, schools and Universities, is so destructive. No one offers their lives for something evil, but they will defend the shining city on the hill, even if it costs us our lives. Regardless, those who have served have trusted the powers to be, and those powers are our responsibility, which is why the character and morals of those we elect is paramount, to make a just decision as to whether we go to war or not.

Our Veterans, are the survivors of the horrors of war. Their eyes have seen what no man should see. They have served a Nation that extols freedom and liberty for all of its citizenry. We must be vigilant, that our Nation is rooted in the God who made it possible for us to fight the greatest military in the world, for freedom. Our youth haven't been taught the goodness of America. They take for granted the freedoms they enjoy, freedoms which cost them nothing. But there was a price, a tremendous price: the lives of those who served.

We have failed our Vets for as long as we have had a military. May we constantly be vigilant and support and demand proper care and every financial and medical assistance due them. To all of our Vets: thank you for your many sacrifices. May you know true peace. May we pledge our support for those who make a vets return to "normal life", like, Tunnel to Towers, the USO, and Wounded Warrior Project.

And may those who have paid for our freedoms with their lives: Day is done, rest my brother in the everlasting peace you so deserve.





Honoring Our Veterans and the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

Each November, the Church invites us to reflect on two profound realities: the steadfast faith symbolized by the **Dedication of the Lateran Basilica** and the noble sacrifice of our **veterans**. Though these commemorations may seem distinct—one rooted in sacred architecture, the other in human courage—they are bound together by a shared spirit of endurance, faith, and service.

The **Basilica of St. John Lateran** stands in Rome as the "mother and head of all churches." Older even than St. Peter's, it was given to the Church by Emperor Constantine after his conversion in the fourth century. Throughout its long history, the Lateran Basilica has endured invasions, fires, and earthquakes—yet it has always risen again, a visible reminder that Christ's Church, built upon the rock of Peter, cannot be overcome by the storms of time. The feast of its dedication calls us to celebrate not just a structure of stone and marble, but the living temple of faith that endures in the hearts of believers across centuries.

In a similar way, we honor our **veterans**, whose lives reflect the same perseverance and strength found in the Church's story. Through their willingness to serve, they embody the Gospel call to lay down one's life for the good of others. The Catholic Church regards military service—when undertaken in the defense of peace and justice—as an act of selfless love. Yet she also recognizes the wounds, both visible and invisible, that such service can bring. Our veterans deserve not only gratitude, but also our prayers, compassion, and care, so that they may find healing in Christ, the Prince of Peace.

As we recall the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, we see in its endurance a reflection of God's faithfulness—a faithfulness that also sustains those who have faced the fires of war and hardship. May this feast remind us that, though trials may shake the foundations of our lives and our world, the grace of Jesus Christ strengthens and renews all who seek Him. In honoring both the Church's enduring faith and our veterans' enduring courage, we proclaim that hope, built on Christ, never fails.




