

AUGUST 8, 2021 19th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"He lay down and fell asleep under the broom tree, but then an angel touched him and ordered him to get up and eat. Elijah looked and there at his head was a hearth cake and a jug of water... but the angel of the Lord came back a second time, touched him, and ordered, 'Get up and eat, or else the journey will be too long for you.' He got up, ate and drank, then strengthened by that food, walked forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God, Horeb...'

'I am the bread of life.""

A reading from the first Book of Kings

The scriptures have been focusing on the 6th chapter of John, asking us to appreciate more deeply the feeding the Lord did for His people and continues for us today.

The seeming miraculous feeding of Elijah shows God's care, His hand, and the response of the prophet to the messenger of the Lord. He needed that food to sustain him and continue his prophetic work.

Jesus, in His concern for the crowd fed them and told His disciples to give the people something to eat. They were hungry.

How many parishes are without priests today to provide the Eucharist. How many of us who have attended mass virtually are yearning to receive holy communion? As Elijah looked and found the food God provided for his journey, may we renew our desire for and seek Him in the Eucharist.




