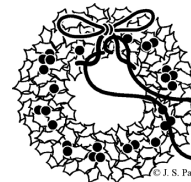

Dear Father Beltran:

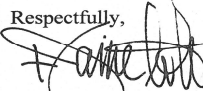

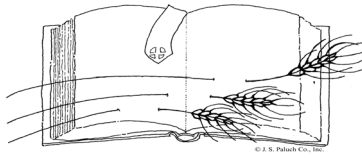
Prov. 31: 10-13, 19-20, 30-31

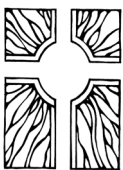
