“In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love and part of our moral responsibility for the common good.”

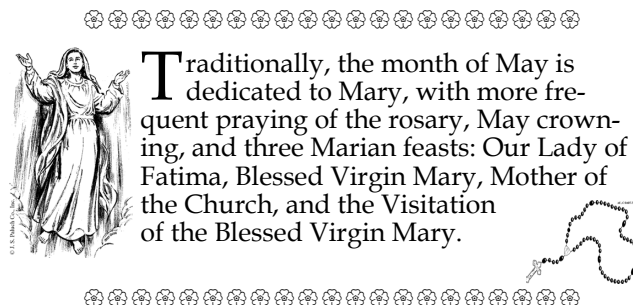

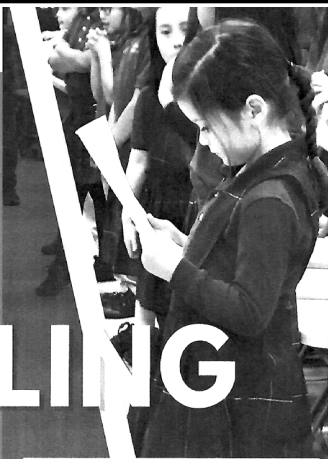
