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REMEMBER 9/11

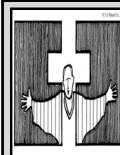
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God our Father in heaven,

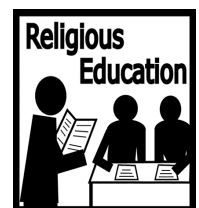
