On Care for Our Common Home ~ The scriptures for this weekend send us a powerful message. Light breaks through darkness as in dawn after the night. God calls us to shelter the homeless and oppressed, feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and "not turn our backs on our own" (Isaiah 58-7-10). In today's Gospel, Jesus calls us to be "salt of the earth" and "light of the world". He calls us to illumine the world with our light and to know the power of letting others see the good deeds that we do. (Matthew 5:13-16)

Actions for this week:

- Remember to bring your grocery bags with you on shopping trips. A conservative estimate is that the average American uses 350 plastic bags each year. Multiply that by family members. Plan to reduce this waste that ends up in rivers, oceans, and landfills. Remember to return plastic bags to the receptacles in our neighborhood stores.
- Thank shoppers that you see for bringing recyclable bags to stores. Introduce yourself and tell them that you are from St. Thomas and we are working together to care for creation.
