Father Tom's Corner

UPDATE ON SISTER PARISH VISIT ~ Fr. Raul

Cardoz, the pastor of our Sister Parish of San Antonio de Padua, Granjas, Merida in Yucatan, Mexico, was planning to visit us the first week of April. He had planned to be accompanied by Sister Leonila Francisco who works in the parish. Unfortunately, since Sister had experienced problems with immigration, it was decided that she not now attempt to enter our country at this time.

In addition, Fr. Cardoz was having difficulty in scheduling a flight which would not include an overnight in Chicago. His English is limited and Sister, who once worked as a missionary in the Bronx, was going to serve as interpreter during the trip here.

It seems best now that we postpone the trip to a later date when perhaps the immigration issues can be resolved and the two of them might be able to spend time over a weekend to be introduced to the parish as a whole as well as meet the new Pastor who will be replacing Fr. Tom after his retirement at the end of April.

FAST AND ABSTINENCE ~ Good Friday is a day of fasting (limiting the consumption of food) and abstinence (refraining from eating meat).

As a sign of our penance, the Diocese of Albany also preserves the custom of not eating meat on the Fridays of Lent. Therefore, all Catholics, 14 years of age and older are obliged to refrain from eating meat on the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59 are obliged to fast on Good Friday.

Fasting refers to the quantity of food eaten. Traditionally, fasting allows for eating only one full meal per day. Two additional, smaller meals may be eaten and there is no eating in between meals.

By retaining these traditions for our Diocese, we do not intend that they be interpreted as laws binding under pain of sin, but as customs from which we will not hold ourselves lightly excused.

LENTEN ALMS envelopes are available for use during Lent. Whatever money you might save through the Lenten tradition of "Giving something up for Lent" can be placed in the Lenten Alms envelope to be collected at the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper. Funds raised in this way will be given to our Sister Parish communities in Yucatan, Mexico.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS will again be held with the children of St. Thomas the Apostle School on the Fridays of Lent at 2:00 p.m. in the church. All are welcome.

Caring for Our Common Home ~ Our parish has initiated a Lenten program called Lent 4.2 Caring for Our Common Home. The theme comes from the reality that if the earth and its resources were evenly divided among every person on the earth, each person would have 4.2 acres for food, housing, clothing, energy and all ones needs. However, it takes 17.2 acres per person to maintain the average American lifestyle. Embracing the teachings of Jesus and Pope Francis, we are encouraged to simplify our lives, exercise more intentional care for the earth and its resources, and focus on prayers, fasting, and almsgiving during Lent. Each week the bulletin will include an insert to emphasize positive ways we can care for our common home and all people who share "this address".

The 1st week centers on **Food** and the choices that we make – to share what we have, to not waste food, to show gratitude, to eat less meat and more grains and vegetables, to be aware of how food is produced, and when possible to buy foods from local farmers and products made close to home.
