PEACE AND PUBLIC POLICY

FEDERAL PUBLIC POLICY/LEGISLATION **UPDATE AS OF 10/11/22**

President Biden signed a Presidential Determination of 125,000 refugee admissions to the US for fiscal year 2023 & the Administration began Operation Enduring Welcome on Oct 1 to resettle Afghans who fall into one of three categories.

On Oct 5, a decision on the DACA program stated it could go forward only for current recipients known as "Dreamers" but no new first-time applications would be processed.

The Global Malnutrition Prevention and Treatment Act passed both houses of Congress and is headed to the President's desk.

WOMEN OF THE WORD

EVE, THE VERY FIRST WOMAN

REFLECT

FIRST READING

The story from Second Maccabees recounts how Jews were tortured to death for refusing to violate God's laws. SECOND READING

Paul asks the believers in Thessalonica to pray for him, Silvanus, and Timothy "to be delivered from perverse and wicked people." What would you like your faith community to pray about for you?

The Sadducees attempted to trap Jesus with a marriage riddle about the resurrection of the dead. How do you deal with friends who challenge what you believe?
