

PARISH MINISTRIES

St. Thomas Parish,

In this weekend's Gospel, we hear the intimate prayer of Jesus to the Father, a prayer not just for the disciples gathered around him, but for us as well as believers. The heart of this prayer is unity, not uniformity (important to know the difference), and a deep communion rooted in love. Jesus prays that we might share in the glory and love that flows within the Trinity, so that the world may come to know the truth of God's love and the mission of Christ. As we reflect on these words, we might be challenged to consider: How are we living out this call to unity in our parish, our families, and our Church?

Unity is not always easy. There are situations where differences in opinion, personality, or past hurts can create division. Yet Jesus continually reminds us that unity is not something we achieve on our own, rather it is a gift of grace rooted in love, born from our relationship with God. In our families, unity might look like patience, forgiveness, and choosing to love even when it's hard. In the Church, it means building bridges rather than walls, focusing on what unites us in Christ instead of what separates us. And in our world, so often marked by conflict and polarization, our witness to unity becomes a powerful sign that God is present. This Gospel calls us to be agents of reconciliation and communion, reflecting the love of the Father and the Son in all our relationships.

As I begin my time as pastor here, I feel particularly moved by Jesus' prayer for unity, "that they may all be one", to take a step forward in building and strengthening our relationships with our fellow churches in the community. These ecumenical efforts are about honoring the faith we share in Christ and seeking opportunities to pray, serve, and learn together. I would love to gather a small group of parishioners who feel called to help explore these ecumenical efforts. Maybe you have an interest in this area, maybe you have an open heart and a desire to foster friendship, understanding, and shared witness. If this speaks to you, please reach out to me. Let's take this Gospel to heart and be part of making visible the unity Jesus prayed for, right here in our own neighborhoods.

On the weekend of June 14 & 15, I'll be sharing a personal reflection on how the Diocesan Appeal has positively impacted my own journey through the seminary. Until then, I invite you to consider making your annual gift. As we've been assured, these funds "cannot be used to pay for CVA settlements or to pay legal fees during a bankruptcy process," and are designated solely for the diocesan ministries and operations we depend on daily. CREATION CARE

BEAUTY AND THE "BEASTS"

Care for Creation, bring beauty to the world. Plant a pollinator-friendly garden and help the tiny "beasts" of pollination to survive and do their "job". Choose native plants. They are adapted to the soil and climate. Place your garden in a sunny area. Adult butterflies reportedly only feed in the sun. Select several varieties of native plants. They will bloom at different times throughout the growing season. Plant groups of flowers. This is more likely to attract pollinators than a single flower. No insecticides. Some native plants for our area: New England Aster, Field Thistle, Button Bush, Purple cone-flower, Closed Bottle Gentian, Spotted Cranesbill, Wild Lupine, Spotted Bee Balm, Black Raspberry, for example.



CONNECT WITH TRADITION AND GROW YOUR FAITH

PRAYER AFTER MEALS

Just as praying before a meal, praying after a meal is meant to inspire in Christians an attitude of thanksgiving and an acknowledgment of our dependence on God.

Though it is a less common practice in the modern world, early Church fathers like Tertullian and St. Jerome extolled the importance of praying after a meal, and the Christian poet Prudentius composed hymns for before and after meals ("ante cibum" and "post cibum").

There are no "official" prayers for after a meal, but the most common one said by Catholics is this: "We give thee thanks, almighty God, for all your benefits, who lives and reigns forever and ever. And may the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God rest in peace." It is a benediction which recalls our perpetual fellowship with the entire Body of Christ, including those who have passed from this life.






