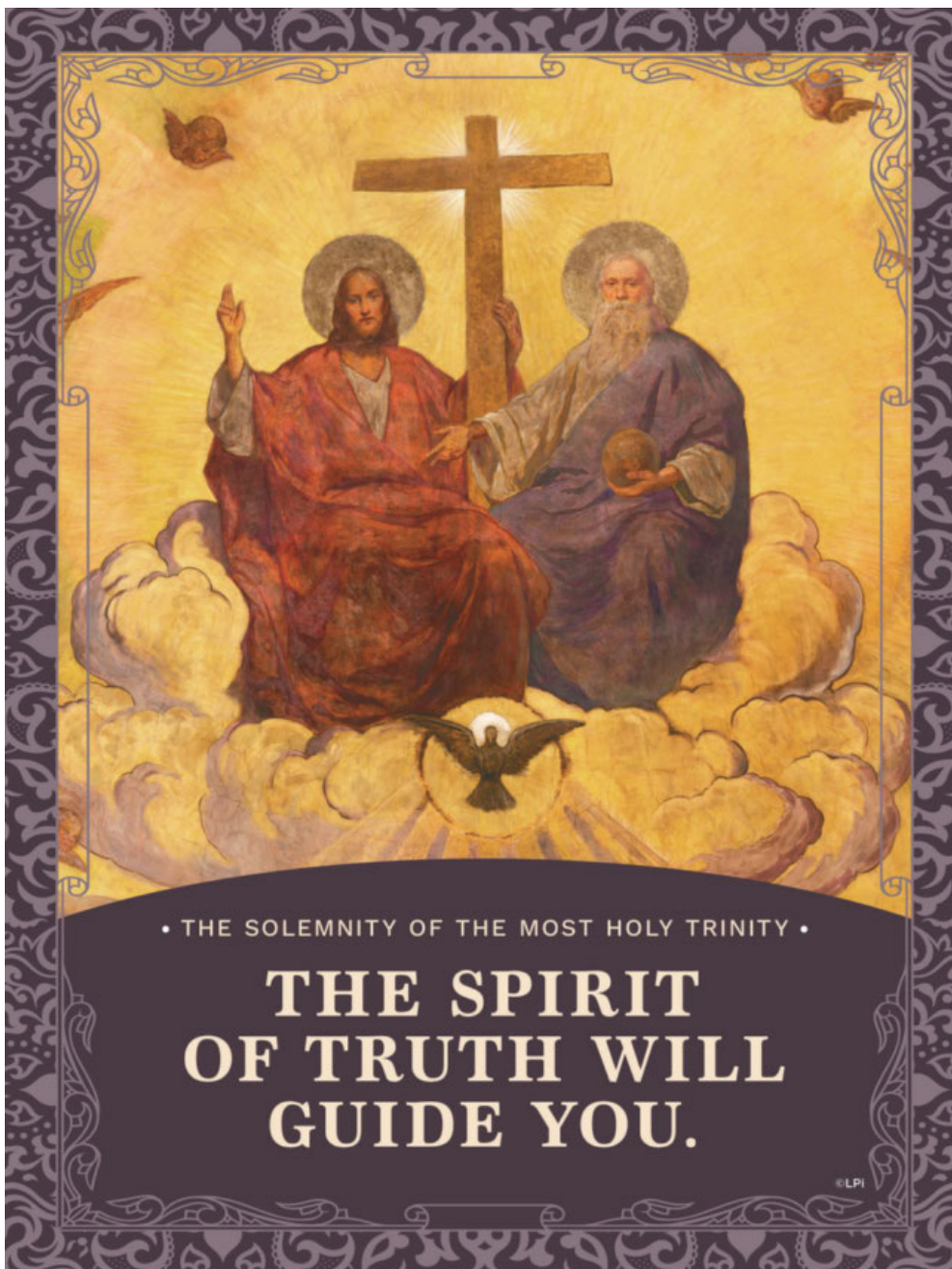

The simplest prayer we know: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." It might be simple, but it's incredibly profound, an indication of the gift we've been given to enter into the very life of God. This weekend, the Church invites us to contemplate the mystery at the heart of our faith: one God in three Persons. Sometimes baffling to wrap our minds around, but good thing it's not a puzzle to be solved. It's relationship to enter into. The Trinity is God revealed to us as a communion of love.

We had some incredible events at our school last week. Several of our middle school students were inducted into the first ever chapter of the National Junior Honor Society at St. Thomas, we had the PreK picnic and moving up ceremony, and the Baccalaureate Mass on Friday morning. My sincere and heartfelt congratulations go to our 8th grade class who graduated on Friday evening! These students exemplify what it means to be a graduate of St. Thomas the Apostle School through their academic achievements and growth in faith. They have clearly demonstrated moral character, leadership, and a commitment to serving others, which are hallmarks of a St. Thomas education. We are proud of each one of them and send them forth to high school with our prayers and blessing! May the Holy Spirit continue to guide their steps and help them to always walk in the light of Christ!

I'm away this coming week at the International Safeguarding Conference in Rome (therefore, no Mass, Confession, or Adoration during the week). This is an annual conference that gathers safeguarding professionals from around the world. It's held at the Pontifical Gregorian University (right next to the Trevi Fountain) and this year's topic is "Women of Faith, Women of Strength." I've been honored to facilitate one of the working groups in North America that has been meeting in the months leading up to the conference. The work we've done will be submitted to the overall contributions, and I'll try and make that document available to the parish in the next couple weeks in case anyone is interested in the fruits of our discussions. We continue to pray that the Church may be a safe place for everyone, and that those who have been harmed at the hands of church leaders may find peace, healing, and justice.

As the fiscal year comes to a close, my sincere thanks go to each person and family who has made a financial sacrifice to the parish and the diocese. It's your generosity that makes it possible to continue the ministry of Christ in our parish, school, and community. Thank you!

Next week: Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ. We'll have a Eucharistic Procession around the block at the conclusion of the 10am Mass on Sunday.

Our program is joining our middle and high school program along with our diocesan office in renaming our program Discipleship Formation. This name change reflects our purpose in going beyond basic faith knowledge & involves a commitment to following Jesus, living out the gospel message and actively participating in the life of the Church. Faith formation is a foundation for discipleship, and as such, we will continue at the elementary level, grades 1-5, to offer instruction in the Catholic faith including sacramental preparation for first Reconciliation and first Eucharist as we help families to pass down their faith to their children & form disciples of Christ. Our elementary class days & times will be changing to the following schedule: Mondays, 4:30-5:30pm, Tuesdays, 4:30-5:30pm, Tuesdays, 6-7pm and Thursdays, 4:30-5:30pm. Each child will be signed up for one of these 4 sessions for the

duration of the 2025-26 year, approximately 24 classes/weeks.

Q&A

I'VE SEEN PEOPLE HANG ROSARIES OVER THE REAR-VIEW MIRRORS IN THEIR CARS AND A FEW OF THEM WEAR THEM AROUND THEIR NECKS. IS IT OK TO DO THAT?

The practice of hanging a rosary or a religious medal off of the rearview mirror of one's car is a fairly popular custom across many cultures. While there is no particular rule approving or condemning this practice, we should also be mindful of the respect and reverence due to religious objects and devotional items (i.e. sacramentals).

An important point to consider would be the reason why one chooses to place a rosary or religious medal in our cars. Is it a reminder of the protection and intercession of Mary and the saints? Does it encourage us to be mindful of God's presence, even in such a mundane task as driving? Is it an outward expression of our more private devotions?

One advantage of having a rosary or religious medal in our cars is that it can also serve as a reminder to pray when we travel, asking for protection for ourselves and for other motorists or commuters. Certainly, invoking the protection and prayers of the saints is a wonderful practice for families, helping to reinforce our belief in the communion of saints and the care and concern we owe to one another.
