PARISH MINISTRIES

St. Thomas Parish,

I'm writing this week's note on Tuesday morning from Rome where I am attending the International Safeguarding Conference. It's an annual weeklong gathering for safeguarding professionals from around the world to learn and discuss important topics in this field, and this year's theme is "Women of Strength, Women of Faith." We'll be hearing from people around the world about challenges and initiatives in their countries about this topic. I'd be happy to share the outcomes with you, maybe we can find a way to do that.

This is also Corpus Christi Sunday, the Body and Blood of Christ, the time each year to reflect on the importance and beauty of the Eucharist in the Church and in our individual lives. In this weekend's Gospel, we story of Jesus feeding the five thousand, a miracle that points us toward the gift of the Eucharist. With just five loaves and two fish, Jesus feeds the multitude, and we see that there is more than enough left over. This act of compassion and abundance teaches us that Jesus continues to feed us today, not with bread, but with his very Body and Blood. The Eucharist is not just a symbol, it is Jesus himself, broken and shared, poured out in love for us. As we celebrate this great solemnity, may we continually be renewed in our reverence for the Mass, and may we bring the nourishment we receive at the altar out into the world through lives of service, generosity, and faith.

It is customary to include a Eucharistic Procession on Corpus Christi Sunday. Following the 10:00am Sunday Mass, we will process together around the block to bring Jesus outside the walls of our church and into the community. Please join the procession! If you're unable make the walk around the block, please feel free to remain in church in prayer and we'll return to church for the final Benediction.

As I announced last weekend, our Mass schedule on Sunday morning will be adjusted to account for some new assignments that are effective July 1. We no longer have the luxury of a second priest available to assist each Sunday like Fr. Jim O'Rourke has so graciously done. Therefore, the Mass times on Sunday morning will be 7:30am and 10:30am and I will go to St. Lucy/St. Bernadette in between. This will start the weekend of July 5 & 6.

Our patronal feast day to honor St. Thomas the Apostle is Thursday, July 3 (it's July 3 every year!). We'll have our usual Mass at 7:30am and I'll also add a Mass that day at 6:00pm. It's good to gather as a community on that day to celebrate and pray for the intercession of St. Thomas!

I'm away next weekend for my friend's priesthood ordination in the Diocese of Scranton, PA. Many thanks to Fr. Adam Feisthamel for celebrating Masses at St. Thomas in my place.

ELEMENTARY NEWS

Plans for Elementary Discipleship Formation (formerly, faith formation) are in the works for the 2025-26 year. Our program is joining our middle and high school program along with our diocesan office in renaming our program Discipleship Formation. This name change reflects our purpose in going beyond basic faith knowledge and involves a commitment to following Jesus, living out the gospel message and actively participating in the life of the Church. Faith formation is a foundation for discipleship, and as such, we will continue at the elementary level, grades 1-5, to offer instruction in the Catholic faith including sacramental preparation for first Reconciliation and first Eucharist as we help families to pass down their faith to their children & form disciples of Christ. Our elementary class days & times will be changing to the following schedule: Mondays, 4:30 -5:30pm, Tuesdays, 4:30-5:30pm, Tuesdays, 6-7pm and Thursdays, 4:30 -5:30pm. Each child will be signed up for one of these 4 sessions for the duration of the 2025-26 year, approximately 24 classes/weeks.

Q&A

I HAVE BEEN GOING TO MASS FOR YEARS AND HAVE ALWAYS WONDERED: WHY DO WE MAKE THE THREE SIGNS OF THE CROSS BEFORE THE GOSPEL?

Certainly, many people go to Mass or other devotions, doing and saying things out of habit or reverence and not really understanding the reasons behind some of these things. But everything we do has a meaning or purpose that helps us to worship better, proclaim our beliefs, or focus the attention of the people on something that has a greater importance or significance. A review of the meaning of various gestures and practices can help us have a deeper appreciation for what we do.

There is a little prayer that goes with the three crosses before the Gospel: "May the words of the Holy Gospel be on my mind, on my lips and in my heart." In standing to hear the Gospel, we acknowledge that Jesus is present, and the words of the Gospel are addressed to us. All of the gestures and special postures we adopt before the Gospel are intended to help us prepare for hearing the Word as well as act on it. The incense, the Alleluia, the deacon or priest, and the special dialogue and announcement that introduces the Gospel help us focus our attention on the Good News we are about to hear. The three signs of the cross show our desire and good intention to hear and live the Gospel.
