St. Thomas Parish,

I remember a couple from my time at Corpus Christi Church in Malta, let's call them Bill and Christine, who were the exact example of Mary and Martha from this weekend's Gospel. Bill and Christine would host many gatherings in their home. Different parish groups, community dinners, friends over, family visits, etc. There always seemed to be cars in the driveway and something cooking on the stove. And whenever I was invited, I would go into the living room and Bill would be the on the couch, engaging people in conversation before dinner. Christine would be running all around in her apron, pulling things on and off the stove and in and out of the oven, bustling with plates and utensils, setting up chairs, an 'energizer bunny' type of person!

Whenever I read this Gospel, I think of Bill and Christine. Bill was a "Mary" character, he sat and listened, engaged in conversation, and made people feel welcomed by his presence. Christine, without a doubt, was a "Martha" character, attentive to every detail, making sure things were just right. And, truthfully, both were necessary. Their hospitality worked because they each brought something different.

In the Gospel, Jesus gently reminds Martha that while her service is valuable, there is a deeper invitation: to be still and present to Him. It's not a condemnation of service, but a call to balance, to recognize when it's time to pause, to listen, and to receive. Mary chose the better part in that moment, and sometimes, we are called to do the same.

In our own busy lives, especially during the summer as we plan, prepare, travel, and host, let's not forget to stop and sit with Jesus. Sometimes the most important thing isn't what we accomplish, but who we allow ourselves to become in His presence.

I'm away this weekend (July 19-20) to assist at a retreat in Wisconsin for people who have been harmed by a leader in the Church. My thanks to Fr. Tom Fallati who is here for Masses. Then I head from Wisconsin to a beach for vacation! There will not be weekday Masses from July 21-25.

A note of congratulations: our school principal, Mr. Adam Biggs, graduated last weekend from the Mary Ann Remick Leadership Program at the University of Notre Dame with a Masters of Arts in Educational Leadership, which is a graduate program in the Alliance for Catholic Education. He's been taking classes during the school year and over the summer for the past couple years, and this degree is the culmination of a lot of hard work. It's a blessing and honor to have this kind of credential here at our school and in our Diocese! Congratulations, Adam!

And we're just two months away from our parish picnic, Sunday, September 21! Mark your calendars!

ST. BRIDGET PRAYERS

St. Bridget of Sweden (d. 1373) was a noblewoman of the Middle Ages whose renowned mysticism centered on the passion of Christ. A mother of eight and an attendant at the royal court in Sweden, as a widow she founded the Order of the Most Holy Savior, advocated for reform in the church and for the return of the Pope to Rome from France.

The St. Bridget Prayers refer to 15 prayers attributed to Bridget which evoke the imagery of Christ's suffering and death, plead for the forgiveness of the supplicant's sins, for a happy death, for fear and love of the Lord, and for a renunciation of worldly desires.

For many years, these prayers were associated with divine promises, though in 1954 the Catholic Church declared that it could not be said that these promises were of supernatural origin. The prayers themselves remain beloved and popular devotions to Christ's passion.
