PARISH MINISTRIES

St. Thomas Parish,

I'm guessing one of the most popular prayers, if not the most popular prayer, is the Our Father. It's said at each Mass, multiple times in the Rosary, and several times throughout the day in the Liturgy of the Hours. Most of us learn this prayer as young children. But what is its meaning to you now compared to when you first learned it?

We hear this prayer in today's Gospel from St. Luke in response to a disciple asking Jesus how to pray. Maybe we've had this same question before too, Lord, how do I pray? It's an important question, and that answer probably changes over time. From rote prayers to spontaneous prayers to prayers in private and prayers with the community. Prayer is the #1 most important thing do develop a relationship with God. We talk to God in prayer, and we listen to God in prayer.

But Jesus doesn't end with the Our Father, he continues with a story. Imagine, Jesus says, you go to a friend's house at midnight looking for bread. At first, the friend says no, he's already in bed, the kids are asleep. But if you keep knocking, not because you're a nuisance, but because you're bold and persistent, he'll eventually get up and give you what you need.

That image of persistence and trust is exactly what Jesus wants us to carry into our own prayer life. It connects back to the line in the Our Father about "daily bread." Prayer is not just about big, dramatic moments. It's about the daily act of showing up before God, trusting God will provide what we need, even if the answer comes later than we hoped or in a form we didn't expect.

My thanks go to Fr. John and Fr. Tom for their coverage here last weekend. I had an incredibly challenging and beautiful weekend at the retreat in Wisconsin listening and ministering to those who have been hurt by someone in the Church. I'm very grateful to the facilitators of the retreat from Awake who do so much work to prepare for that weekend and make it so meaningful.





DOES "'GIVE US THIS DAY OUR DAILY BREAD" REFER TO OUR REQUEST OF GOD TO PROVIDE FOR OUR TEMPORAL NEEDS (FOOD, SHELTER, CLOTHING) OR TO OUR DAILY NEED FOR THE EUCHARIST, THE "BREAD OF LIFE?"

Yes, "give us this day our daily bread" does refer to both our temporal needs and our need for the Eucharist. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states:
"In the fourth petition, by saying "give us," we express in communion with our brethren our filial trust in our heavenly Father. "Our daily bread" refers to the earthly nourishment necessary to everyone for subsistence, and also to the Bread of Life: the Word of God and the Body

of Christ." (2861)
