How do you measure your wealth? Jesus is very clear in today's Gospel: "for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." In many ways, our wealth is measured by materials: money, things, items, tangible things that we can hold in our hands and buy and sell. And many of these things are good things, they keep us safe and healthy.

But the parable Jesus tells today reminds us that it's not material things that matter most to God, it's what we have in our hearts that is most important. The rich man in the parable stored up grain, built bigger barns, and made plans to relax and enjoy life, but he forgot one essential truth: our time here isn't unlimited, and we don't bring any of our stuff with us. What God desires is that we be rich in what matters to Him. Faith, generosity, compassion, humility, trust, love...those are the important treasures.

It may be easy to fall into the trap of thinking, "Once I have enough, then I'll give. Then I'll help. Then I'll make time for others." But Jesus flips that thinking on its head. The invitation is not to wait, but to live generously now. To recognize that our true wealth lies in relationships, in service, in our response to God's call today, not tomorrow.

I'm very excited to make an announcement about a new evangelization and education service that we'll be using at the parish. Thanks to the generosity of a parishioner, we now have a parish account on www.formed.org, a rich treasure trove of materials on every possible aspect of the faith you could imagine. Much more info to come on how this will be used, but I wanted to whet your appetite!

Given that our next Holy Day is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Friday, August 15 (Masses at 12:15pm and 7:00pm), I'll be offering two sessions about this beautiful celebration using materials from Formed. Tuesday, August 12 at 1:00pm and 6:30pm in the Chapel (same presentation, two different times for convenience). I'd invite you to learn more about the Assumption of Mary into heaven where she continuously intercedes to Jesus on our behalf.

A call for help: We have several weddings on the calendar coming up in the next few months, and I'm looking for a couple handfuls of volunteers who would be able to assist with the rehearsal and wedding process. 


According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, there is a connection between asking God for forgiveness and forgiving other people. "The fifth petition begs God's mercy for our offences, mercy which can penetrate our hearts only if we have learned to forgive our enemies, with the example and help of Christ." (2862) (Also see 2838 – 2840). However, forgiveness does not mean condoning or denying the harmful act that someone has committed, but rather, not wishing the person harm and being able to pray for him or her. "It is not in our power not to feel or to forget an offense; but the heart that offers itself to the Holy Spirit turns injury into compassion and purifies the memory in transforming the hurt into intercession." (Catechism, 2843)

St. Francis of Assisi, knowing the difficulty of forgiveness, wrote in his meditation on the "Our Father," "And what we do not completely forgive, make us, Lord, forgive completely that we may truly love our enemies because of You and we may fervently intercede for them before You, returning no one evil for evil and we may strive to help everyone in You."
