

PARISH MINISTRIES

St. Thomas Parish,

The parable that Jesus gives us this weekend flows very naturally from last weekend's Gospel. If you recall, we had the parable about storing up treasure in the barn, the lesson being that we can't take these material things with us to heaven, our ultimate destination. Remember, the hearse doesn't have a roof rack! Today we hear a scripture passage that's often read at wake services on the evening before a funeral Mass. What's the connection between this parable and last weekend's, and why use it at a wake?

Both parables speak to how we live in light of our mortality. Last week's parable warned against the illusion of permanence that wealth and comfort can bring. This weekend's Gospel shifts the tone a bit. Instead of a warning, we hear a promise: "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom." Rather than clinging to earthly security, Jesus invites us to trust in the treasure of heaven, which is a treasure that is inexhaustible, eternal, and prepared by a loving Father. And yet, even with this reassurance, there's still urgency: be vigilant, be prepared, be faithful in your responsibilities, because "at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

Holy Day of Obligation this week: the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is this Friday, August 15, Masses at 12:15pm and 7:00pm. I'll be offering two sessions about this beautiful celebration on Tuesday, August 12 at 1:00pm and 6:30pm in the Chapel (same presentation, two different times). I'd invite you to learn more about the Assumption of Mary into heaven where she continuously intercedes to Jesus on our behalf.



WHY IS IT SO IMPORTANT THAT WE REGISTER IN A PARISH? ISN'T IT GOOD **ENOUGH THAT WE GO TO MASS?**

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish. ©LPi
