

St. Thomas Parish,

When we picture Jesus, I'm sure we often think of his gentleness, his compassion for the poor, his miracles of healing, and his words of peace. One of his more famous titles is "Prince of Peace!" That's why this Sunday's Gospel might catch us off guard. Jesus says he has come to "set the earth on fire" and even speaks of division within families. These words can sound startling and out of character until we look more closely at the meaning.

Jesus is speaking in the middle of his journey toward Jerusalem where his mission will culminate in the passion, death, and resurrection. The "baptism" he refers to is not the one in the Jordan River, but the baptism of suffering he will endure on the cross. The fire he longs to see blazing is the fire of God's love and the purifying power of the Holy Spirit, which will be poured out on the Church at Pentecost. But that fire demands a choice. Either to accept and live by the Gospel or to reject it. And because not everyone will make the same choice, the result can be painful division, even within families.

Following Jesus is not always comfortable. The fire he speaks of is a call to deep transformation, and that can stir resistance at times. But we are not left alone in this struggle! The Letter to the Hebrews teaches us to "persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith." He has gone before us, enduring the cross for the sake of the joy set before Him, and now reigns in glory.

Speaking of running the race...the 1st annual Tiger Trot 5K is coming up on Saturday, September 6. There's also a free race for kids under 12 following the 5K. 



GREGORIAN CHANT

Gregorian chant is an ancient form of sacred music used in liturgical worship and prayer. Defined by a monophonic (meaning a single melody without harmony or chords), unaccompanied song, this type of chant focuses the singer's mind on the content of the prayer being sung, which makes it uniquely suited for use in the Mass.

Dating to the first millennium, it derives its name from Pope St. Gregory the Great, though scholarship is unclear on when exactly this type of chant originated. Prior to the Second Vatican Council, it was standard to use Gregorian chant in the Roman Rite Mass. Sacrosanctum Concilium, the Constitution on Divine Worship promulgated by Pope Paul VI in 1963, asserts that Gregorian chant is "specially suited to the Roman liturgy...(and) should be given pride of place in liturgical services."
