PARISH MINISTRIES

St. Thomas Parish.

In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus confronts the scribes and Pharisees with direct words that cut to the heart: "Woe to you who build the memorials of the prophets whom your fathers killed." I remember learning about St. Bruno, whose feast we celebrated just a few days ago on October 6. He was a brilliant scholar and teacher in 11th-century France and admired by many for his wisdom. Yet, when he felt God calling him to leave behind the comfort and prestige of academic life to live a life of silence and prayer, people thought he was out of his mind! His choice was to follow God's call, which is always to seek holiness over honor. Unfortunately, this wasn't understood by most of his contemporaries.

His story reminds me about how easy it is to admire the saints after they're gone while forgetting about the courage it took for them to follow God when it was unpopular or inconvenient. It's the same with Jesus' warning to the Pharisees that challenges us to do more than build memorials to the saints of the past. It really calls us to recognize the prophets and holy witnesses among us today, right now, and to have the courage to follow the truth, even when it unsettles our comfort. May we not only build memorials to the prophets of the past, but live courageously the message they proclaimed.

Two big things to focus on this month, and then a million little things!

#1: Remade for Mission: This is a diocesan-wide effort from now until April to consider one fundamental question: what is our mission from Jesus Christ, and how do we fulfill that mission? (I guess that's two fundamental questions!) The mission of Jesus and his Church is simple and beautiful: the salvation of souls. Our destination is not an earthly one, it is a heavenly one, and the mission of the Church is to make Christ present on this earth and guide us to heaven. What goes into fulfilling that mission? Lots of things! Sacraments, ministries, clergy, church buildings, finances, time, etc. "Remade for Mission" is a look at how we are best using our resources to fulfill the mission.

The next step in this process is a series of synod listening sessions. Our network is us, St. Lucy/St. Bernadette, Christ the King, and St. Matthew's. We'll be rotating around the four churches for these sessions from now until April. Most of them will be on a weeknight, but the first one is **Saturday, October 18 from 12-2pm at St. Matthew's** in Voorheesville. *The invitation is open for anyone to come to pray, listen, and contribute to these important conversations*.

#2: The Annual Gala is this coming Friday, October 17, and we're celebrating the 70th year of education at St. Thomas School. Thanks to so many of you, we have sold out just about all of our tickets! If you're not able to be there, I would encourage you to make a donation in support of one of our honorees. We have many incredible honorees (listed at www.stthomas-school.org/gala) and they deserve our sincere thanks for all the ways they have contributed to our school and parish! Thank you for your support!

A million other things: Diocesan Appeal is in the works, this is Respect Life month as we focus our prayers for the support of life in all forms and stages, it's the month of the Rosary, Children's Liturgy of the Word every Sunday at the 10:30am Mass, and Discipleship Formation classes are off and running. Make sure you're subscribed to the Weekly Updates that come out each Friday on Flocknote, and you can watch the Monday Message on Facebook and Instagram.

I'm away this week in Orlando to present at a conference for canon lawyers from the United States and Canada. My topic is about boundary considerations with adults and how that intersects with potential consequences and delicts in Canon Law. Therefore, no Mass or Confession on Monday, Tuesday, or Thursday, October 13-16. I'll be back late on Thursday night.



DEVOTIONS. EXPLAINED! CONNECT WITH TRADITION AND GROW YOUR FAITH

CREEDS

Most Catholics can recite at least portions of the Nicene and Apostles Creed by heart — but though these are perhaps the best-known two creeds of modern times, Church tradition has yielded many more. A creed (from the Latin "credo," meaning "I believe) is a summary of the most important articles of faith agreed upon by a group of people who hold them as truth. Tradition attributes authorship of the Apostles' Creed to Christ's 12 Apostles. The Nicene Creed originated at the first worldwide ecumenical council in Nicaea in 325 AD. The Athanasian Creed is another famous statement of belief approved by the Church, this one focusing particularly on the matter of the Holy Trinity. All approved creeds fulfill Christ's Great Commission to "make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19) and the need for Christians to "always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who calls you to account for the hope that is in you" (1 Peter 3:15). ©LPi
