## The Church's Teaching Authority

Matthew 16:18-20; 28:18-20 Catechism: 85-95; 888-892

Priestly celibacy, women's ordination, the death penalty, abortion—all were "hot" topics that Joe, a recent convert to Catholicism, had never thought much about. As he became more involved in the Church, however, Joe's interest in these issues grew. He decided to research the Church's positions on these and other controversial issues.
