

WHAT! Each decade of the World Mission Rosary represents a different area of the world where missionaries Red shows the fire of faith that brought the


continue to share the Good News of Jesus.

He even had his own television show — and won an Emmy Award! Archbishop Sheen died on December 9, 1979. His cause for sainthood was opened in September 2002.
