Christmas Seafarers' Shoebox Program at the Port of Houston








Try to pack a shoebox full of new items such as these:

Saint Frances Cabrini Patroness of Immigrants



Frances Xavier Cabrini was born in Italy in 1850.
She had 12 brothers and sisters. When she was 18, she wanted to become a nun, but she was too sick to do so. She worked on her parents' farm for many years, until they died.

One day a priest asked Frances to teach in a girls' school. She liked it so much that she founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart to care for poor children in schools and hospitals. In 1889, at the urging of Pope Lep XIII, Mother Cabrini came with six nuns to the United States to work among the Italian immigrants.

Filled with a deep trust in God and gifed with a wonderful ability to get things done, Mother Cabrini founded schools, hospitals, and orphanages to help the Italian immigrants and children in America. When Mother Cabrini died in Chicago, Illinois, on December 22, 1917, her institute numbered houses in England, France, Spain, the United States, and South America.

In 1946, Pope Pius XII canonized Mother Frances
Xavier Cabrini as the first American citizen to
become a saint!
