SYNOD SMALL GROUPS THIS FALL

The Minneapolis/St. Paul Archdiocese is in the 3rd year of the Synod. In this final year of the process, we are to be a "church engaged". Archbishop Hebda is requesting all parishes to participate in this process which includes the formation of small groups within each individual parish, to pray, discuss and offer feedback on three topic areas.

The three topic areas are Forming missionary disciples, Forming parishes, and Forming youth and young adults. These groups at Holy Family will meet once a week, for 6 consecutive weeks, from September 20th - October 29th. The following dates and times have been selected as the primary meeting days and locations for our parish.

Mondays, Sept 20 - Oct 25, 10am-12pm in Fr. Moorman Hall or
Tuesdays, Sept 21 - Oct 26, 7pm-9pm in Crusader Hall

Each small group session format is guided by a video that includes prayer, a short teaching, personal testimonies, and an opportunity for group discussion. Groups will host about 8 members and will include a Facilitator and a Scribe. Facilitators provide a welcoming presence and gently guides the table discussion. There is no additional commitment outside of the weekly session. After the session, Scribes electronically input the data from the feedback forms of those at their table (less than 30 minutes per session). We are in great need of people to fill these roles. No prior experience is needed and training is provided. If you are interested or would like more information, please contact Linda Wandrei at boysnlinda@msn.com.

A sign-up form is available. Groups will be formed as Facilitators and Scribes become available. You will be notified of your group assignment at the first session. If you are an existing small group within our parish and are planning on participating in the Synod Small Groups from your home, or would like to form a small group at a different time than those listed, please contact Linda Wandrei for more details and added training that will be needed.

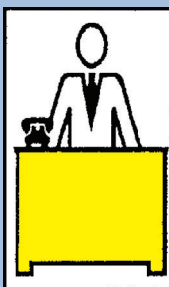

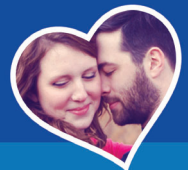
