Each year I challenge our students to use their free time over the summer to read more. I'd like to extend that invitation to our adults as well. God gave each of us a brain and wants us to use it! - 4) If you are not currently a regular adorer or on the sub list, but would **like to be** in the system and notified of sub requests you can create an account by clicking on this link and selecting the 'Sign Up' button.


