- 4) If you are not currently a regular adorer or on the sub list, but would **like to be** in the system and notified of sub requests you can create an account by clicking on this link and selecting the 'Sign Up' button.

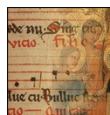
### CHANT CAMP FOR HIGH SCHOOL TEENS

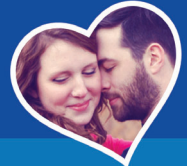
